COMMUNITY COUNCILLOR ROLE

Role Purpose

- 1. To represent effectively the interests of the ward for which elected and to deal with constituents enquiries and representations.
- 2. To promote the causes which reflect the best interests of the ward for which elected and of West Berkshire in general.
- 3. To promote the overall well being of the organisation, partnerships, community stakeholders and voluntary and private agencies.
- 4. Responsible for developing and promoting community governance across West Berkshire.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. To work with other Councillors and officers of the Council:
- 2. To meet the statutory requirements of an elected Member of a local authority, including compliance with the Model Code of Conduct.
- 3. To develop a working knowledge of the Council's policies and practices.
- 4. To develop a working knowledge of the Council's management structures, management arrangements, powers and duties and constraints and to develop good working relationships with relevant officers of the Council.
- 5. To play an active part in any outside body to which appointed and to provide a means of two-way communication between that organisation and the Council.
- 6. To represent West Berkshire Council to the community and the community to West Berkshire Council, through the various methods available.
- 7 To contribute to open government and the development of increased democracy through the active encouragement of all sections of the community to participate in the "governance" of West Berkshire.
- 8. To contribute to community leadership leading to an improvement in the quality of services provided to the public of West Berkshire which also meet individual and community needs.
