Background

- 1.1 Under the new Planning Policy Framework introduced through the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 the South East England Regional Assembly (SEERA) has the responsibility for producing a Regional Spatial Strategy for the South East. SEERA have started working on the development of this document, which is known as the South East Plan. Part of the South East Plan will be identifying the levels of housing to be provided up until 2026. The purpose of this report is to make members aware of work that has been undertaken in respect to the development of the South East Plan.
- 1.2 As part of the development of the plan SEERA identified a number of sub-regions within the South East of England which they considered had more specific issues that may need to be addressed through the development of sub-regional strategies. One of the sub-regions identified as an area known as the Western Corridor and Blackwater Valley sub-region. A large portion of West Berkshire is identified as lying within this sub-region. Part of the brief set by SEERA was to consider how housing may be accommodated within the sub-region including exploring potential options for distribution and the capacity of accommodating housing levels above the current Regional Planning Guidance figures set in 2001. Members and officers of the local authorities within the sub-region have produced a report setting out issues relating to the sub-region, the impacts that would arise from different levels of growth together with a preferred approach to distribution. The report that has been submitted to SEERA together with the preferred option for distribution is attached as Appendix 1.
- 1.3 Having carefully considered all the issues raised by the growth options, the Western Corridor and Blackwater Valley Members' Steering Group resolved as follows:

'Housing levels continuing at RPG9 are preferable subject to the necessary infrastructure improvements; housing provision at RPG9 +10% is the most that could be accommodated but only if there is significant investment in infrastructure to support such a level of growth. Any housing provision above RPG9 +10% is unacceptable.'
- 1.4 There has been no opportunity as part of this process to formally consult on the work that has been undertaken so far. SEERA will be considering this submission as part of the work it is undertaking to develop the South East Plan. A formal consultation will take place in January 2005 to consider the overall approach and it is understood that this will provide the level of housing that SEERA consider should be accommodated within the sub-region. It is understood that there will be a further round of consultation in summer 2005 which will be looking at the level of housing distribution at a district level.
