Purpose of Report:

1. Background

- 1.1 The Constitution Task Group, at its meeting on 15th November 2004, delegated authority to the Licensing Committee to propose revisions to the Constitution resulting from changes brought about by the Licensing Act 2003. Revisions put forward by the Licensing Committee would then need to be agreed by Council on 14th December 2004.
- 1.2 There is a need to articulate the procedure for dealing with Licensing Applications at Licensing Sub-Committee meetings. Therefore attached as Appendix 6(a) is a proposed form of words to be included in Part 7 (Regulatory and Other Committees Rules of Procedure) of the Council's Constitution.
- 1.3 Appendix 6(b) is a proposed Code of Conduct for Licensing which it is intended to include in Part 14 (Codes and Protocols) of the Council's Constitution as Appendix H. The Code of Conduct for Licensing has been sent to the Chair of the Standards Committee for information and comments. Any comments received will be reported to the Licensing Committee at the meeting.

2. Timing of and Attendance at Sub-Committee Meetings

- 2.1 The Licensing Committee needs to consider the timing of Sub-Committee meetings in order to carry out licensing application hearings. The Licensing Trade has strongly indicated that they wish hearings to be held during the day as they are currently. If the Council decided against daytime meetings this could possibly lead to legal challenge.
- 2.2 It is suggested that four Members are called to attend all Sub-Committee meetings. If only three Members are called the Council runs the risk of not being quorate, which would occur if a Member was unavoidably detained or taken ill. Not being quorate could potentially lead to the Council having to pay abortive costs. A further risk of only calling three Members was if a prejudicial interest came to light during a hearing this would invalidate the proceedings and again could lead to the Council having to pay abortive costs.
