On behalf of myself James Thompson and my wife Lynne Thompson of the above address we wish to object in the strongest possible terms against the application for an Off Sales shop licensed to sell alcohol within 50 m of our home.

We have both personal views and others relating to the immediate area and community in our wish to oppose this application.

I will endeavour to clarify.

- There is not enough traffic spaces to support this application near to our house, we need 24 hour access down the side of the building to our house, both my wife and I have been denied this at various times by cars parking on the private road leading to our rear access.
- Noise must be considered as our property boundary is less than 50m from the proposed shop
- The opening hours particularly 23:00 and 24:00 hour closing times are excessive, this has a noise implication, passing foot traffic, vehicular traffic etc. Again less than 50m from our boundary
- There is an off license part of the CO-OPerative barely 750m from the proposed development (this is open 7 days)
- There are various appeals etc by local people, Parish Council etc to help the town centre, there are at least 2 licensed outlets within 5 mins walking distance already plus many, many public houses-this could potentially take business from established businesses.
- There is a large school within 300m with hundreds of schoolchildren passing this parade of shops on a daily basis—these children deserve to be protected against the menace of alcohol abuse. Additionally exposure could potentially lead to under-age drinking and subsequently to the binge drinking culture which blights main streets across the UK. with the government guidelines on alcohol advertising this should be considered
- We have on a few occasions had our garden wall torn down by people late in the evenings (something various neighbours have had too this can be verified by Thames Valley Police); a shop licensed to sell alcohol could exacerbate this anti-social problem.

- An increase in litter could be envisaged, at the moment we pick up empty bags, empty beer cans, bottles etc from our garden on a Saturday and Sunday morning—deposited by people walking past-again this would potentially be multiplied by this proposed shop
- We feel that West Berkshire Council should not uphold this application for an alcohol license as, again, government guidelines are advising people to be more aware of alcohol consumption, having another licensed premise in the Parish does not lend itself to promoting good health—again the schoolchildren must be considered and the influence on their thinking.
- In summary I have 4 main licensing objectives detailed below and consider this application particularly inappropriate in what is mainly a residential area
- 1. PREVENTION OF CRIME AND DISORDER
- 2. **PUBLIC SAFETY** there are concerns regarding people congregating in the area (similar to what happened at the CO-OP), a huge increase in the immediate area with moving vehicles.
- 3. **PUBLIC SAFETY** there is a strong likelihood of nuisance from increased pedestrian and vehicular traffic particularly late at night with associated litter and noise issues.
- 4. **PROTECTION OF CHILDREN FROM HARM** this is an area where young people are known to gather.

We would be obliged if you take the above into consideration and take the decision to refuse the application.

I write to object to the above application for a Premises Licence.

My interest is as Senior Deputy Head at Kennet School and write at the bequest of the Governors of the school.

57 Station Road is in close proximity to Kennet School with many of its 1740 pupils walking past the property daily to attend school. At their time of travel it is proposed that the off licence would be open.

Kennet School has been awarded Healthy Schools Status and thus we promote healthy living styles with respect to exercise and the hazards to health of alcohol, cigarettes and diet. It is therefore a concern to us that on our very doorstep the off licence would be actively promoting the goods we are educating pupils to consider with caution and control to maintain their health.

Further, the proposed store would not have a client base during the day; it will therefore seek to sell other products such as sweets and chocolate thus targeting our pupils. The government is determining its set-up for healthy school meals banned the sale of confectionary at schools and sought to prevent the sale of it within the proximity of schools.

















The proposed retailer could well act as a magnet to pupils to break bounds and seek to spend their dinner money against their parents' wishes.

We are aware that a minority of pupils smoke and from time to time a group will congregate to the rear of the premises. Easier access to cigarette sales is bound to compound the problem. Besides giving a wrong image of our pupils, the inevitable litter is unsightly for the public.

The sale of alcohol so near to the school is a concern, not because it will attract our pupils, but it could bring the wrong element into the area seeking to purchase drink and put our pupils at risk.

The school has many evening functions and combined with the needs of the Leisure Centre there is a huge and well documented pressure on car parking in the area. The majority of prospective customers would need to drive to the off licence causing increased traffic congestion on what is a hazardous junction. The co-op store at the Burdwood Centre already retails a range of beverages and meets the local community needs.

I trust that the arguments presented demonstrate that such a location is totally unsuitable for the siting of an off licence and that the application is rejected.



Protection of children:

There is a secondary school 500 meters away – children look older than they are these days, and are likely to be served alcohol underage. Please do not say the law states they cannot be sold alcohol as we both know this is likely to happen. The school pupils all congregate behind the shops and make a lot of noise.

Public Safety/Public Order

This is a highly built up area with very limited parking, across the road is a parking bay which was put there for the use of residents. At various and frequent times of the day as a resident you cannot park in these spaces as they are constantly in use by the 3 existing shops – a hairdresser; a vet and a café. The vets surgery has their own car park, which we were assured would be used for all clients and staff parking. I write to object to the above application on the following grounds:

Protecting Children from harm Public Nuisance Public Safety

The property in question is only a few yards from Kennet Secondary School and when various agencies are working hard to combat teenage alcohol abuse it seems ludicrous that there would be alcohol on sale at such close proximity to a large number of young people. There are currently cutbacks to support services that work with young people and the decision to place temptation in such a prominent place is not a wise one. Although young people are unable to purchase alcohol for themselves, it is common practice for them to ask older friends or even customers on their way in to the shop to buy alcohol on their behalf. I know this is an offence but it happens none the less.

I understand the alcohol licence is for $8.30 \, \mathrm{am} - 11.00 \, \mathrm{pm/Midnight}$. I cannot understand why a shop in a residential area would need to be selling alcohol at these times. There are other licensed premises in The Broadway and Burdwood Centre – both approx ¼ mile from the premises in question. I can only assume that the licence is to encourage further drinking after other licensed premises have closed. In an area predominantly surrounded by residential housing with children I feel that this will cause public nuisance with cars coming and going at all times and also those on foot already having consumed alcohol causing a disturbance.

Public Safety would also be in question as the area that the unit is in is on a fairly busy road – particularly during school times. Parking is very limited and the area just outside the shop is very busy with school children being dropped off. There is no crossing point and to my knowledge there have been several instances of children being knocked over on this stretch of road. Another distraction will obviously add to the danger. If the premises owner is thinking that the car park to the rear of the shops can be used for customer parking – I think you will find that this car park belongs to the Vet Surgery. There were few objections to the land being converted from a garden to a car park as this surgery is only open for a very limited time during the day and 1 hour early evening therefore causing minimal noise nuisance to the residential gardens which surround the car park. This is very different to being used as a car park for licensed premises open until midnight.

Please take my objection into consideration when dealing with this license application.



I write to object to the above application for a Fremises Licence.

My interest is as the freeholder of 55 Station Road (GKG Vets) and the owner of 55a Station Road, both of which are directly next door to the applicant

The current occupants of the flat above 55a Station Road are a young family with a small child and a baby on the way. These are tenants of ours, on an Assured Shorthold Tenancy Agreement. The current occupiers of the shop are GKG Vets, with a long lease, who have a regular flow of adults with children and animals including dogs on leads.

The current occupier of 57a, above the proposed Off Llicense is a single lady.

I object to the Licence being granted on the following grounds:

Protection of Children from Harm

57 Station Road is located very close to the entrance to Kennet School, around 1700 pupils with ages up to 18 years old. We have an ongoing battle with some of the children who regularly come round to the back of the shops/flats in the row and smoke. Presumably an Off Licence would sell digarettes and this would attract the children to try to purchase, and therefore potentially add to the problems. It is clearly not sensible for a shop to be providing digarettes for sale right outside a school. We are in regular contact with the school regarding this problem, however it is very difficult for the school to practically solve. Allowing an Off Licence, I believe, would only hamper the school dealing with this

An Off Licence selfing alcohol/cigarettes outside a school gate is clearly providing an attraction for the older children. Whilst the shop should have in place its' own controls to ensure that alcohol/cigarettes are not sold to minors, clearly if provides a convenient location for older pupils to make purchases for younger ones. We do not currently find that any of the pupils are drinking behind the row of shops, however there is a greater risk of this should it be more straightforward to purchase alcohol conveniently over the road from the school.

Frankly, it seems quite abourd that any Off Licence should be located right outside a school.

Public Safety and Public Nuisance

When we were given planning permission for the veterinary activities at 55 Station Road, tight time restrictions were put in place, to ensure that the residents in the immediate area were not disturbed by the cornings and goings at the Vets. Clearly, the possible arrival of a late opening Off Licence, somewhat flies in the face of this. There is going to be increased vehicle activity, which will cause problems, as during the evenings the area outside the row of shops is generally occupied by local residents parking their cars. Whilst the owners of the shops actually own the land on which the residents park, we have no problem with them doing so. I do not want visitors to the proposed Off Licence parking on my land.

On this basis, where are night time visitors to the proposed Off Licence going to park? The shop itself has no planning permission for parking as far as I am aware, at the rear of the property, and they certainly only have room for one or two cars outside the front of their property.

I am very concerned about the type of person who needs to go purely to an Off Licence late at night. This, in my opinion would attract people with little regard for the surrounding properties/residents. I believe that we would see an increase in noise, litter/broken bottles/beer cans etc. GKG Vets has, on a daily basis dogs walking to them on leads.

Broken glass that is not cleared up will give severe problems to these dogs and their owners.

I think it unlikely that the Off Licence staff will welcome being responsible for clearing up the mess.

Groups of children gathered behind the shops can appear threatening/intimidating, and this is not in line with the right of our tenants and their neighbours to enjoy quiet habitation and unrestricted access to the properties they are renting. We already find the school children smoking in the stairwells, and have to ask them to move on. We must not allow a situation to occur where people are drinking behind the shops, and frightening the young families that live above.

Crime and Disorder

Thatcham has an ongoing problem with disorder from some of the younger elements of the community. It is necessary to try to keep them in the well lit, more open areas of the town centre. Providing this new attraction for them to purchase alcohol risks moving them to a quieter, darker, more out of the way location. This will inevitably lead to criminal damage and disruption to a currently quiet neighbourhood.

There are plenty of empty premises available within the town centre of Thatcham, which is a far more suitable location for an Independent Off Licence as it is not right outside a school or in a quiet residential area. There is also ample opportunity for the locals of Station Road/Kennet Heath to purchase alcohol and cigarettes until 11.00pm 7 days a week at the well run CO OP located centrally, half way down Station Road in the Burdwood Centre.

Please accept this letter as my objection to the above referenced application to change 57 Station Road, Thatcham into an Off Licence.

My objections are as follows:

- I am a local business owner and am concerned that, although on paper, this
 will be an Off Licence, I am certain that it will be selling items such as
 chocolate, soft drinks, sandwiches, crisps. All of which I currently sell only 2
 doors away. The current climate is already making business very difficult for
 me and I feel that competition so close could indicate the end of my
 business.
- 2. There are 3 other shops selling alcohol within a 5 minute walk of these premises and I believe that Threshers recently closed down in the village due to the competition from those same shops. There is no local need for this business.
- 3. This location is in a highly residential area with local residents living above the 3 utilised shops in the parade (one of which houses a young family with a new baby) and to both sides and across the road.
- 4. Kennet School is located only 50 metres away from the location. People purchasing cut price alcohol during the school runs at 0830 or 1515 is not what any parent would want their child to see a number of parents use the parking area outside of the shops for this purpose. I believe that Mr Dick has already made his representation to you.
- 5. Independent Off Licences are known to be a focus of disorder and disturbance and will undoubtedly attract undesirables to the area late at night, which is not only a worry for the local residents but also for me as a business owner. I am deeply concerned that I may be replacing windows on a regular basis and in fact am concerned for the overall security of my shop.
