

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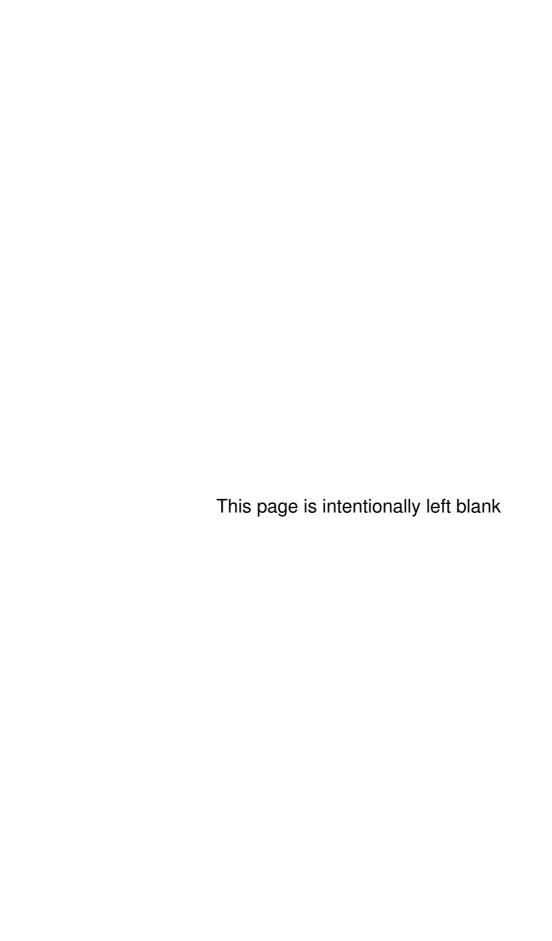

PERSONAL LICENCE APPLICATION & POLICE OBJECTION - Mr. Karol Mitrik

On 7th January 2014, Thames Valley Police as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003, received from West Berkshire Council, an application for a Personal Licence for a Mr. Karol Mitrik, born 17/05/83.

The applicant on 13th June 2011, appeared before +Reading & Sonning Magistrates Court and was convicted of an offence of Driving a Motor Vehicle with Excess Alcohol, Fined £400, Costs of £85 and Disqualified from driving for 18 months. He therefore fails to meet the condition in section 120(2)(d) of the Licensing Act 2003.

Having formally received a notice from the licensing authority under section 120(4), Thames Valley Police are submitting an objection notice under section 120(5).

Having regard to the applicant's convictions, Thames Valley Police are satisfied that granting this application would undermine the crime prevention objective under the Licensing Act 2003.

In summary, the reasons for being so satisfied are as follows:

- (i) The offence for which the applicant was convicted was an offence of driving or being in charge of a motor vehicle with alcohol concentration above the prescribed limit. This is a relevant offence for the purposes of section 120 of the Licensing Act 2003 (see paragraph 14(c) of Schedule 4).
- (ii) That offence involves the misuse of alcohol.
- (iii) Driving with excess alcohol is probably one of the most serious motoring offence which can cause danger to other road users.
- (iv) As a personal licence holder, the applicant would be expected to play an important role in controlling the supply of alcohol to others.
- (v) Insufficient time has passed since the applicant's conviction in June 2011 to show that he can now be expected to fulfil the important duties of a personal licence holder. The Rehabilitation of Offenders Act states this offence shall become spent five years after the date of conviction i.e. 13/06/2016.
- (vi) For all those reasons, granting a personal licence to this applicant would undermine the objective of preventing crime and disorder.

We reserve the right to expand on these reasons at the hearing of the application.
