Supporting Information

1. Background

- 1.1 The Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education (SACRE) was established in accordance with Section 390 of the Education Act 1996 by West Berkshire District Council acting as the Local Education Authority.
- 1.2 The SACRE was established to set the RE syllabus, advise the Local Authority on matters connected with religious worship and advise on methods of teaching, the choice of materials used and the provision of training for teachers.

2. Nominations for membership of the West Berkshire SACRE

2.1 The standing Advisory Council on Religious Education comprises four groups each with a single vote to use when voting is necessary.

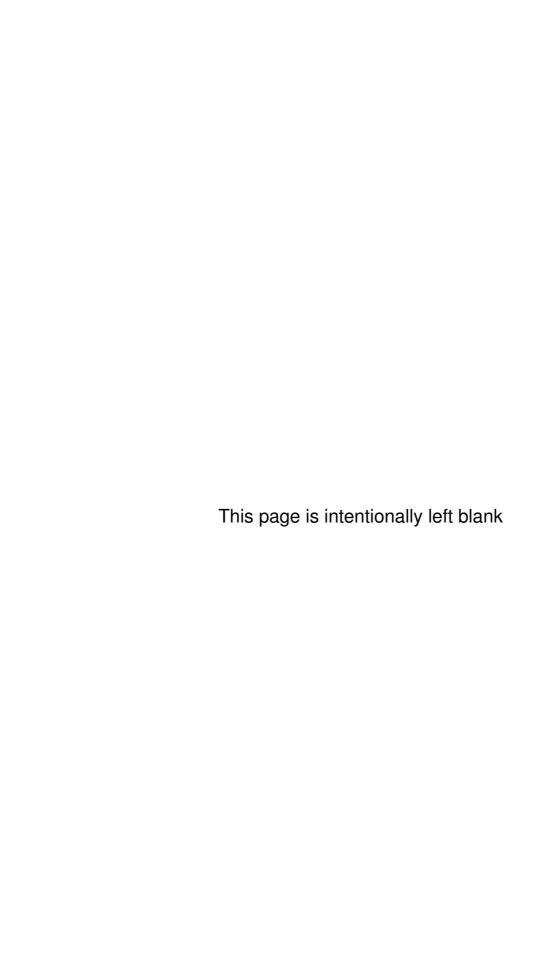
The four groups are:

Group A: Representative of Christian denominations other than the Church of England and of other religions	Group B: Church of England representatives
Group C: One representative from each of the following teacher association: NUT, NAS/UWT, ATL, PAT. NAHT and ASCL	Group D Representatives of the local authority

- 2.2 The Local Authority is responsible for appointing members of each of these four groups. This is usually achieved by seeking nominations from each area.
- 2.3 Nominations had been received for Mrs. M. Pratico, Mr. Robin Sharples, Becky Aboutaj and Sr Harriet Thomas and following consultation no objections were received to these nominations.
- 2.4 There are two vacancies for Group A representatives (Free Church). A letter has been sent to West Berkshire Council by the Fellowship nominating Mrs M. Pratico and Mr Robin Sharples.
- 2.5 There is also a vacancy for a Group A representative (Muslim). A letter has been sent to West Berkshire Council by All2gether nominating Becky Aboutaj.
- 2.6 Sr Harriet Thomas has been nominated by the Catholic Diocese of Portsmouth as a representative for the Catholic Church.
- 2.7 It is therefore proposed that these nominations be accepted.

Supporting Information

1. Background

- Twice each year the Speed Limit Task Group carefully considers the introduction or amendment of speed limits that have been requested by Members, Parish or Town Councils, members of the public or officers. These requests are assessed with regard to the Department for Transport Circular 1/2013 (setting local speed limits), the character and nature of the road, the recorded injury accident record and any available traffic survey data.
- 1.2 The Speed Limit Task Group, which met on 29th October 2014, is comprised of the following members:
 - Councillor Graham Pask.
 - · Councillor Keith Woodhams,
 - Andrew Garratt, Principal Traffic & Road Safety Engineer,
 - · Alan Dunkerton, Speed Management Co-ordinator,
 - Chris Hulme, Thames Valley Police Traffic Management Officer.
- 1.3 The Task Group considered a total of 9 requests for an amendment or introduction of a speed limit at the following locations:
 - 1. Newport Road, Walton Way and its culs de sac, Newbury request for a 20mph speed limit.
 - 2. A4 Bath Road, Marsh Benham request for a lower speed limit,
 - 3. B4000 between the A4 and Stockcross request for a 40mph speed limit,
 - 4. B4000 west of Stockcross village request for a lower limit,
 - 5. A340 Tidmarsh request for extension to southern 30mph speed limit
 - 6. Crookham Common Road between Thornford Road and the Crookham Park Home site request for a 40mph speed limit,
 - 7. Inglewood Road, Kintbury request for a 30mph speed limit
 - 8. Radley Bottom, Hungerford Newtown request for a 30mph speed limit,
 - 9. Oxford Road, Chieveley request for a 50mph speed limit.

2. Speed limit Process


- 2.1 If the recommendations contained in this report are approved then the individual sites will be taken forward to the statutory consultation stage, which means that the formal and public consultation of a speed limit can be undertaken. This will include consulting a wide range of statutory consultees together with the appropriate parish/town council, local members and local residents by the way of a notice published in the local newspaper, notices erected on site and publication on the Council's web site.
- 2.2 A report of any comments and objections received during the formal consultation together with an officer's recommendation will be presented to the Executive Member for Highways, Transport (Operations), Emergency Planning, Newbury Vision for Individual Decision. Should the proposal to introduce or change a speed limit be considered appropriate then that proposal will be implemented.

3. Recommendations

- 3.1 The Task Group considered all the above requests and recommended that the following are progressed to the statutory advertisement and consultation stage:
 - 1. Newport Road, Walton Way and its culs de sac, Newbury introduce a 20mph speed limit,
 - 3. B4000 between the A4 and Stockcross village introduce a 50mph speed limit.
 - 8. Radley Bottom, Hungerford Newtown introduce a 30mph speed limit if the specified minimum length in Circular Roads 1/13 can be reduced. If not then introduce a 40mph speed limit,
- 3.2 The Task Group recommended that no further action is taken on the following requests with regard to the speed limit, but further measures should be considered where shown below:
 - 2. A4 Bath Road, Marsh Benham,
 - 4. B4000 west of Stockcross village investigate if a build out (or similar) could be introduced by the recreation ground to reduce traffic speeds,
 - 5. A340 Tidmarsh.
 - 6. Crookham Common Road between Thornford Road and the Crookham Park Home site investigate signing and lining improvements,
 - 7. Inglewood Road, Kintbury,
 - 9. Oxford Road, Chieveley investigate if the vegetation can be cut back at the junctions.
- 3.3 All the persons requesting the speed limit amendments will be informed of the Executive Member's decision.
- 3.4 Subject to there being no objections received to the statutory consultation for individual Traffic Regulation Orders for each speed limit, the advertised restrictions will be introduced.
