**M** Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

#### a) General – all four licensing objectives (b, c, d and e) (please read guidance note 9)

The DPS fully understands her roles and responsibilities concerning the four licensing objectives obtained within the 2003 Licensing Act, a comprehensive breakdown of these objectives and how to ensure they are met are detailed below.

The DPS attended the APLH level 2 training programme and her personal licence has been issued by West Berkshire District Council.

The DPS will take full responsibility of ensuring all staff are trained and have full knowledge of all licensing issues concerning them under the 2003 Licensing Act including the Challenge 25 rule.

The applicant offers the following measures to accompany the mandatory conditions as laid out by The Licensing Act 2003, to form part of the operating schedule.

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The unit has it's own internal security shutter to secure when staff of Alcoholla are not in attendance.

Unity House has its own security measure to cover the whole building.

Orders have to be paid for at the point of order, no cash payments on delivery will be permitted. All delivery drivers shall be directly employed by Alcoholla and shall all receive training from the DPS regarding their responsibilities when delivering alcohol.

Should a driver arrive to make a delivery and feel that the purchaser or any other person at the delivery address, has already reached a level of intoxication, and should they feel that completing the delivery may cause subsequent issues, then the delivery shall be refused and returned to the unit. The driver will also enter the refusal into the refusals register and report to the DPS.

#### c) Public safety

The DPS will be responsible for conducting any relevant Fire Risk Assessment and also a Health & Safety Risk Assessment for the licensed premises.

All appropriate notices in relation to public health & safety will be displayed at the premises.

The DPS will also ensure the premises will be operated in line with the Health & Safety Act and any environmental health issues will be the responsibility of both the licence holder for the premises and the DPS.

There shall be no access to the unit by the general public. Only those authorised and/or employed by Alcoholla shall be permitted entry.

#### d) The prevention of public nuisance

The DPS/Premises licence holder fully understands that it is their duty to prevent their business causing any nuisance to any local residents or businesses.

They will monitor the external premises area in relation to any anti-social behaviour or public nuisance.

The premises will only accept trade deliveries or rubbish collections during normal working hours.

The DPS will also monitor the exterior of the premises to ensure litter is kept to a minimum.

In the event of any anti-social behaviour both inside and outside of the premises, the DPS will make any CCTV recordings available to the local Police immediately.

All drivers employed by Alcoholla shall receive relevant training in regards to their responsibilities under The Licensing Act 2003 and when delivering alcohol.

Should a driver arrive to make a delivery and feel that the purchaser or anyone else at the delivery address, has already reached a level of intoxication, and should they feel that completing the delivery may cause subsequent issues, then the delivery shall be refused and returned to the unit. The driver will also enter the refusal into the refusals register and report to the DPS

#### e) The protection of children from harm

The DPS will be responsible for ensuring all staff working within the premises will be fully trained and aware of the Challenge 25 Rule.

The premises will only accept valid forms of identification such as photo driving licence, passport and home office approved ID cards displaying the national proof of age standard scheme (PASS hologram).

All customers who look under the age of 25 shall be challenged to prove their identity when purchasing alcohol.

The premises will also have a refusals register, which will be kept at the premises at all times and all refusals by any member of staff shall be recorded.

The register will be made available to Responsible Authorities on request.

All delivery drivers shall be directly employed by Alcoholla and shall receive relevant training in regards to their responsibilities. A record of this training shall be kept in a training register and any training given shall be refreshed at appropriate intervals.

All customers purchasing alcohol through the online or telephone facility will be asked to confirm that they have read and understood the Terms & Conditions of their purchase.

Should it be found that anyone under age has attempted to make a purchase, or that the purchase is intended for a minor, the transaction will be refused and returned to the unit and the refusal recorded in the register and reported to the DPS.

The storage facility where orders are picked will only be accessed by employees of, or persons authorised by Alcoholla who will be aged 18 years or over and aware of their responsibilities.



We have read the above planning application and wish to object to the granting of the license on the following grounds.

#### The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

Although the business is deemed to be a delivery service and the general public should not be able to visit the premises to buy alcohol there is a concern that should the business become established the whereabouts of this distribution outlet could become known to the public who may attempt to buy alcohol at this facility and disorder or anti-social behaviour could arise as a result.

The standard operating hours appear to be from 18.00 to 04.00, whilst crime and disorder may be preventable from the distribution unit, we feel strongly that from a social responsibility perspective, delivering alcohol in the early hours of the morning to people who are partying is a very bad idea and could well lead to crime and disorder at the place where the delivery is being made.

#### **Prevention of Public Nuisance**

The standard operating hours appear to be from 18.00 to 04.00 and we note in the license application that this business wishes to operate 'seasonal hours' during the Christmas New Year period - an extended period of 09.00 to 18.00 which is an additional 9 hours. Specifically from 20<sup>th</sup> December through to 2<sup>nd</sup> January is outlined for these unusual opening times, this is a time of the year viewed as holiday time, there is no data given to forecast the amount of traffic that will be operating within this timeframe, what the workers shift patterns look like or what type of vehicles are going to be running throughout the night and the impact this will have on the noise or light pollution.

We observe that there is no other request for seasonal variations e.g. Easter or other bank holidays. This therefore raises a conern in our minds as to whether this is just a 'pop up' venture for someone who is looking to maximise sales over the Christmas and New Year period rather than a sustainable business proposition that would be a great asset to the New Greenham Park.

I refer to my letter of yesterday's date and today's date and our telephone conversation.

I have now had sight of the application.

I confirm that my representations continue to be made and are in respect of the third licensing objective, the prevention of public nuisance.

Section M(d) does not describe what arrangements will be made to secure that there is no noise disturbance at the premises. As previously noted, it is seriously disturbing to have motorcycles revving up in the early hours, vans running their engines, and deliverymen congregating outside, and of course noise emanating from the business activities during the night. In this regard we have concerns about the extended sales hours during Christmas and the New Year.

Section L of the application indicates that the premises will be open to the public. This is inconsistent with the business being conducted as distance sales online or by telephone.

It is essential that there must be no off-sales directly from the premises, and of course no on-premises sales. Sales (if the licence is permitted at all) must be by delivery

only, to residential premises. No sales deliveries should be permitted to premises in the Business Park (which would provide a simple way to circumvent licence conditions). Likewise any off-sales must be effectively wholesale, ie having a minimum sales value that prevents the sale of individual bottles or cans.

I have now been informed that the application is being made on behalf of Alcohalla, a business that delivers alcohol to consumers at night-time.

I would repeat that the Business Park is located in a residential area and I repeat my earlier objection.

I would make the following further comments:

- (a) Before the Council consider granting any licence, it should carefully examine the level of noise that will be generated by this business. It is seriously disturbing to have motorcycles revving up in the early hours, vans running their engines, and deliverymen congregating outside.
- (b) The planning department must consider whether it will permit this activity in the Business Park when other overnight activities have been strictly curtailed.
- (c) We would prefer that no licence should be granted but, were the Council minded to grant one, it is essential that there must be no off-sales directly from the premises, and of course no on-premises sales. Likewise any off-sales must be effectively

wholesale, ie having a minimum sales value that prevents the sale of individual bottles or cans.

I am writing to object to the application for a new premises licence for the supply of alcohol at the above premises.

The application is made for the hours from 18.00 to 04.00 Monday to Sunday and thus envisages the premises being open all night every day of the week all year.

There are no further details given in respect of the application and I can find no planning aplication in respect of the premises, so I do not know whether the applicant intends to open an all-night pub, an all-night cafe, an all-night nightclub or an all-night off-licence. Any of these activities would be inappropriate in the proposed location, which is an office and light-indistrial business park.

I would remind the Council that the Business Park is located in a residential area, which has been here for over 100 years, long before the park or the airbase before. There is a range of houses right near to the above address, whose residents would be substantially affected by the presence of an all-night alcohol premises nearby. The presence of on- or off-premises of whatever nature will attract drinkers and other customers to the site from all around, creating noise and disturbance all the time.

Strict limits have been placed on premises in the Business Park operating outside normal business hours. The same limitation should apply to the proposed activities. You will appreciate that we do not wish to be kept awake at night, whether as a result

of HGVs and forklift trucks operating in the Business Park or as a result of an allnight premises of whatever kind attracting customers.

No details are given as to how customers would access these premises at the proposed times when no public transport is working. If these are on-premises, is one to expect drunk drivers to be careering out of the Business Park onto the A339 throughout the night?

In conclusion, the New Greenham Business Park has been established for local light industrial and office business operating during normal business hours, not as an all-night "Party Central" for the West Berkshire area.

Accordingly, I urge that this application be refused.
