Please give a general description of the premises (please read guidance note 1)

The applicant is proposing to construct licensed premises which will form part of a new development running alongside Bath Road (A4) but accessed from Dorking Way. The premises will be a pub restaurant which will have the benefit of a car park with some 54 car parking spaces.

It is intended that the Applicant's premises will have in the order of 150 covers internally. The proposed premises will open as a public house providing a substantial quality food offering and limited regulated entertainment. The extent of the development is illustrated on the deposited plans along with the location of the site. Application will be made for a permit for AWP machines once the Licence is granted.

Application for Planning Permission has been submitted.

The premises has residential accommodation which includes the Manager's accommodation on the first floor.

The layout is proposed in accordance with the plans deposited with the Licensing Authority with this application, being: -

- Ground floor licensing plan - 3699/L105 forming the principal plan for licensing purposes showing both internal and external areas to be licensed.
- First floor licensing plan - drawing no. 3699/L106
- Site layout plan - 3699/P100E

All licensable activities are to take place internally in the area outlined in red. The licensable activities limited to sale by retail of alcohol, late night refreshment and recorded music only are proposed to be permitted to the external areas.

The premises seek to be able to sell to residents and supply their bona fide guests 24 hours per day, as per the non standard timing sought in accordance with the usual permission permitted historically.

The premises is to have the benefit of external areas. To the front of the premises and facing onto Dorking Way will be an elongated patio which will have the benefit of waitress service to the same standards as that afforded internally. To the side of the premises will be a landscaped area which will also have waitress service when appropriate and will have the benefit of a limited children's play area. That areas has not yet been identified as to its location and therefore for the sake of simplicity the whole of the landscaped area has been included within the Licence.

On opening the premises will trade under one of the applicant's brands as a quality food led outlet. There will be high levels of service and some waitress provision to the dining areas.

Other licensable activities, in particular regulated entertainment will be ancillary to the provision of food and alcohol. It is anticipated that any such regulated entertainment will be provided on an occasional basis only and limited to 12 occasions per year, although likely to be significantly less.

Appropriate noise attenuation measures are included within the structure of the new build and it is not anticipated that any issues will arise in relation to noise to local residents. The Operating Schedule has been completed on this basis.

The name of the premises will be provided in due course.

Describe the steps you intend to take to promote the four licensing objectives:

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e) (please read guidance note 10)

This is an application for a new Premises Licence to be constructed with access off Dorking Way but located between Bath Road (A4) and Dorking Way and will form part of a development. The layout is particularised on the plans and has the benefit of external areas which are sought to be licensed. It will offer food internally and externally. Marston's have constructed many premises of this nature and on this occasion the premises are intended to operate as a rotisserie and will be supported by family friendly facilities including both internal and external children's play areas.

The above is provided by way of explanation and is not intended to be converted into conditions.

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

The applicant has undertaken a risk assessment in connection with the operation of this unit taking into consideration the area in which it is located and their previous experience of units of this nature and their operation and impact on the immediate vicinity.

With regards to the prevention of crime and disorder the applicant would offer the following steps in order to address this issue: -

1. Alcoholic drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers saved for consumption in external areas provided for that purpose.
2. No customers carrying opened bottles of alcoholic drink upon entry shall be admitted to premises at anytime the premises are open to the public.
3. It is considered that for the nature of the operation door supervisors will not be required however, the Designated Premises Supervisor will undertake a risk assessment should unusual events takes place and if they consider it appropriate will employ the same.
4. Any persons exercising security (as defined by paragraph 21a of schedule 2 of the Private Security Act 2001 shall be licensed by the Security Industry Authority).
5. Such person will be employed at the premises at the discretion of the designated premises supervisor/holder of the premises licence.
6. CCTV shall be provided in the form of a recordable system.
7. Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the premises and the bar servery.

8. Equipment shall be maintained in good working order and correctly timed and dated.

9. Recordings will be available for a period of 31 days and handed to the Police on request.

10. The premises will operate a proof of age scheme and will require photographic identification from any person who appears to be under the age of 21 years.

c) Public safety

The applicant has undertaken a risk assessment with regard to public safety.

As this is a New Build all equipment will be to the latest standard and will be British Standard approved.

The applicant will ensure that fixtures and fittings provided to the premises will be of an appropriate nature.

The applicant undertakes to comply with reasonable requirements of the Building Control Officer. In any event, the approval of these statutory authorities will be required before the premises can open to the public.

Proposed condition :-

The Premises Licensee will comply with the reasonable requirements of the Fire Officer from time to time

d) The prevention of public nuisance

The applicant has undertaken a risk assessment with regards to public nuisance.

The applicant proposes conditions as follows: -

1. Where appropriate prominent and legible notices shall be displayed at all exists requesting the public to respect the needs of the local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.
2. The doors and windows to the premises are to be double glazed.

e) The protection of children from harm

The restrictions set out in the Licensing Act 2003 will apply. No unusual or additional risk of harm to children have been identified.

1. No films or videos of any description will be shown so that they can be viewed by persons under the age of any applicable BBFC/Local Authority certification.
2. Children under the age of 16 shall not be permitted to enter or remain at the premises after 22:00 unless resident, dining with an adult or attending a pre booked function.



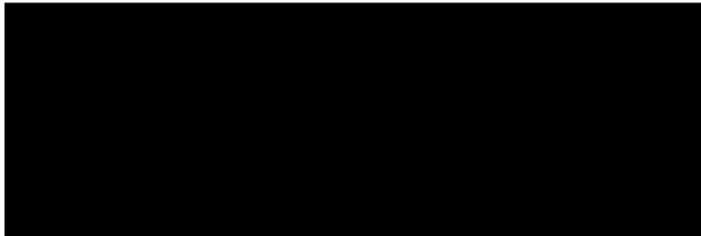

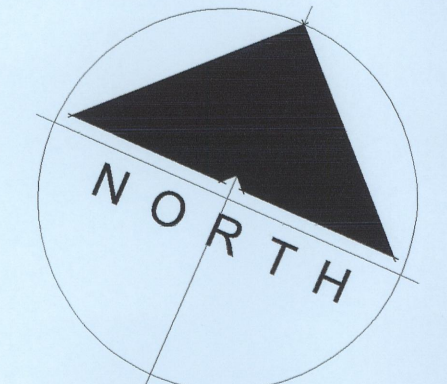

GROUND FLOOR PLAN

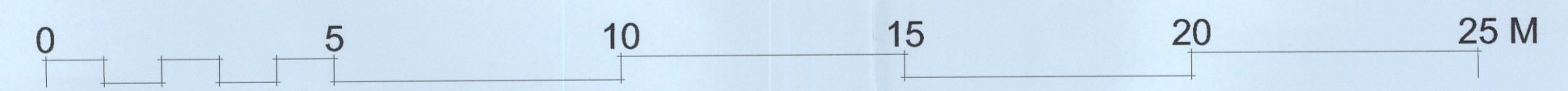

We respond to the application for provision of regulated entertainment, sale of alcohol and late night refreshment at the junction of Bath Road and Dorking Way, Calcot. We object to the granting of a license and make the following further comments.

A. Public Safety

We draw to your attention that the application is for premises which would be within a few hundred yards, and in plain sight of, Junction 12 of the M4 Motorway.

There is no demand from Calcot residents for a Pub/Restaurant. The nearby Murdoch's at the junction of Langley Hill and Bath Road closed through lack of custom and has been derelict for the past few years.

This will be known to the applicant and the calculation has to be that proximity to the busy M4 Motorway will enhance custom at the new premises. That inevitably will involve drinking and driving.

Were the Council to grant a license to sell alcohol from this location it would be endorsing, if not encouraging, drink driving. We call upon it not to do so.

B. The Prevention of Public Nuisance

Locations close to Motorway Junctions are much favoured by the Travelling Community. The area surrounding Calcot is constantly visited by travellers. The field from which the application would provide alcohol is presently fenced off. Once alcohol was licensed to be sold that fenced off field would become a car park and openly available to be used by travellers and the hooligan element of local youths.

Note also that with the elimination of Sainsbury's roundabout traffic from the Pub/Restaurant cannot turn right on exiting Dorking Way into the Bath Road. All traffic wanting to head towards Reading would drive down Dorking Way thus creating late night noise and nuisance.

Granting a licence would provide a further source of alcohol within an area already so heavily populated with licensed premises that crime, disorder and public nuisance have already reached problem levels for the local police particularly in Theale and Tilehurst.

Noise, public nuisance, anti-social behaviour, low-level nuisance (non reportable crime inc. shouting, swearing, urination in public, littering) will be increased.

The prevention of public nuisance

Local residents will be directly impacted by negative effects of the extended licensing hours' leading to increased footfall & vehicular traffic at unsociable hours, including large delivery vehicles at unsociable hours, with the *only* access being via Dorking Way. Noise, light pollution, traffic and traffic noise will all have a negative impact

When the 54, proposed, car parking spaces fall short the overspill will impact on local residents – patrons parking in Dorking Way & surrounding roads

There is already a large litter issue on the estate caused by customers of the local fast food establishment, this is likely to be further exacerbated by the planned licenced premises

Residents in this area already suffer noise nuisance and antisocial behaviour from the local fast food and shopping establishments and the fact that the premises seek to be able to sell to residents and supply their bona fide guests 24 hours per day, as per the non standard timing sought in accordance with the usual permission permitted historically will only add to these

Public safety

The likelihood of inebriated drivers and foot traffic will be introduced into the estate by the proposed licenced premises

An establishment of this nature, directly adjacent to a very busy, already overloaded, pitifully inadequate, road infrastructure with the only access being via a heavily residential area has the potential to put public safety at great risk from inconsiderate road users seeking "easier/quicker" ways to enter/exit the premises to make their travelling journey less "bothersome".

Subject: Application objections

Further to your referenced application above, (the first notifications were so flimsily attached by brown tape (of which I have pictures) which subsequently blew away over the Christmas period and needed to be replaced by cable tied notifications recently - so one may question the legitimacy of the original notification!) we vigourously object to the license granting of this establishment on the following, but not limited to, grounds:-

1. The prevention of Public Nuisance

Having seen the proposed sale of alcohol hours of this establishment, (which are considerably longer than the current local pubs within close proximately), being

10.00a.m.and Midnight – Monday to Thursday

10.00 a.m. and 01.00a.m. Friday and Saturday

11.00 a.m. to Midnight Sunday

Bank Holidays extended and un-quantified ‘other limited days’ **which means what -please clarify?**

Regulated Entertainment – **which means what -please clarify?**

Please explain, in writing, why our local licensing Department (who, we assume, are part of the local council we pay our council/ local taxes to) even contemplate such a venture, unless there is something currently un-disclosed between the interested parties, when the remaining few local pubs are experiencing so much difficulties in current trading conditions?

We, as residents within 200 yards from the proposed development, will, without doubt, be subjected to constant late night noise of drunken revellers leaving the establishment early morning (no doubt using our front gardens as a public toilet and potential vandalising to our property!) when the area already has a high rate of crime as available in the government crime statistics?

Increased noise and pollution from delivery lorries as well as the upheaval of construction traffic during any future construction of this unnecessary development will also be incurred.

Currently Dorking Way exit onto the A4 is currently used as a ‘cut through’ and results in a stationary line of queuing traffic outside of our house during the school term time rush hour in the working week resulting in a significant increase in air pollution. As there is only a left turn exiting Dorking Way, all traffic heading towards Reading will have to drive through Dorking Way, creating increasing and constant traffic noise and environmental damage/pollution. Also the plan shows a roundabout replaced years ago!

We do not expect this application to allow coaches, heading East or West along the M4, going to sporting events, to attend these proposed premises after the regular hooligan events that used to happen between rival fans in Theale High Street a few years ago hence a banning order.

Having lived in Dorking Way for over 26 years we have seen the demise of local pubs/restaurants within the local area as also witnessed recently in Theale with the remaining few pubs that are all struggling to survive. The Red Lion and Murdock's have all closed, the Lamb was sold for development, the Crown is under new management [REDACTED], the Volunteer is up for sale and the Winning Hand, along the A4, is being re-developed into a retirement home.

2. The prevention of crime and disorder

This pub/restaurant has the potential to increase anti-social behaviour especially when the pub is closing as been witnessed recently in Theale with the remaining few pubs that are all struggling to survive.

This location (so close to the M4) will without doubt result in an increase in local drug dealing (as already being reported in Theale, hence the recent 2 stabbings). Unfortunately I have witnessed first-hand drug dealing in the IKEA car park while waiting for my wife/son's IKEA purchase, a frightening experience, I would not wish to repeat. [REDACTED] where, we the local neighbours were awakened by police sirens and helicopters hovering above!

This has also the potential to entice a meeting place for young youths to congregate, as has been witnessed in other local shops and establishments, that can continue throughout the night, and year, and when they get bored the residents suffer the consequences of their unruly behaviour, hooliganism and fast food takeaway rubbish being thrown into our gardens.

3. Public Safety

When members of the public walk past this establishment, late at night, who will protect them from unwarranted attention from drunken revellers, or as recently happened in Theale violent behaviour/gang related activity.

We assume that double yellow lines will be enforced to stop customers parking along Dorking Way and on the grass verges outside our property as on many occasions there have been cars being parked on the cycle lane (which could become increasingly very dangerous for the people who use the cycle path for what it is intended for!) so as to avoid any accidents occurring to cyclists.

This development will undoubtedly result in increased costs to the local tax/council payers as well as creating more strain on the emergency services i.e. police, NHS so who will be, **and it won't be us**, footing the additional increase in council tax, to cover the cost of a development we strongly object to in the first place!

Perhaps what is most concerning is that developments like this appear to be a type of 'Trojan horse' in respect that once approved, a second application, in close proximity, may be earmarked for a Marston's Inn/Travel Lodge (as advised to us by the surveyors of the site last year) either replaces the housing development or results in a new development in the other field opposite? Can you please provide a full irrevocable indemnity that this will not be the case.

Finally what indemnities are you able to provide in writing that, should any of our initial observations, included but not limited to above, occur will not affect us in Dorking Way as we have never suffered any issues since we moved here over 26 years ago.

Holybrook Parish Council **OBJECT** to the following application.

Marston's state that this pub/restaurant will, predominately, be for the use and enjoyment of families. However, their application is not reflective of this.

Based on the four licensing objectives the Council make the following comment:

The prevention of crime and disorder:

The Police are aware of existing drug usage/dealing in the area and, as such, the Parish Council would expect mitigation measures in relation to the pub/restaurant to be cited in the Premises Licence.

The licence application does not satisfactorily address any emergency closure or evacuation procedures in the event of violence, power failure of similar occurrences.

The Parish Council acknowledge that Marston's are presenting this application as being for, predominately, families. However, this is not reflected in the late night/early morning opening hours, the provision of late music, food and drink inside and outside, and that pub games, namely a pool table and darts could be made available, and the mention of an application to come for Amusements with Prizes.

As far as can be determined, there is no designated outside smoking area. Smoking areas are known to cause disorder in terms of noise pollution. Depending on where the smoking area is to be located, existing and new residents could be detrimentally effected by this.

The Parish Council ask, how will Marston's encourage the safe drinking of alcohol? The proposed location of the pub/restaurant is in very close proximity to the M4, junction 12 and so safe drinking is especially important.

Of note, people visiting the pub/restaurant cannot exit onto the A4 Bath Road towards Reading; this will push increased traffic onto the residential area of Dorking Way/Charrington Road at unsociable hours.

Public safety:

Holybrook Parish Council wish to make the licencing authority aware that the proposed pub is in a residential area comprised, mainly of family homes. Within close proximity of the pub is a community centre and pre-school.

The application states that alcoholic drinks may not be removed from the premises in open containers and that no customers carrying opened bottles of alcoholic drink upon entry shall be admitted. However, Marston's do not intend on employing doormen so how will these issues be appropriately dealt with?

This application does not address the issue of external lighting to assist in public safety or in the prevention of public nuisance.

The prevention of public nuisance:

It is noted from the application that the doors and windows to the premises are to be double glazed. However, how does this help with noise reduction from the two outside dining areas? Or when the windows and doors are opened during the summer months? The proposed 'traditional pub area' (although as stated in the premises licence application as undefined) is in the planning application shown as opposite the proposed three bed houses which are, of course, intended for families. There is no doubt that these homes (should they be built) and the existing homes, which face directly onto this site, will be affected by late night noise from the diners/drinkers and recorded music.

After 11.00pm background noise levels will be reduced i.e. traffic flows and many people, especially children will be in bed. Noise from the pub/restaurant, particularly the outside areas, will cause local residents sleep disturbance.

The protection of children from harm:

Although the application does address this issue for children attending the pub, it does not consider the children who live in very close proximity. With the late/early morning licencing, particularly in the outside area, children will be caused sleep deprivation.

Based on the information provided above and in support of our residents Holybrook Parish Council strongly object to this application and argue that, in particular, the late licencing hours do not support the family culture and will, in fact, be detrimental to the family lives of the local, existing and new residents of Holybrook.

Finally, the licencing hearing is scheduled before the planning decision has been made for this building and the Parish Council strongly believe this to be prejudicial to the whole process.

Your reference: 17/01790/LON – Marstons PLC – referring to the provision of regulated entertainment and sale of alcohol and late night refreshment affecting Dorking Way and surrounding area, Calcot, Reading.

Further to the referenced application above my wife and I would like to register our objection to the proposed licence of this establishment on the following grounds:

Prevention of Public Nuisance

Having seen the proposed sale of alcohol hours in a residential area, which are considerably longer than current local establishments within close proximity being between:

10:00am and Midnight - Monday to Thursday
10:00am and 01:00am - Friday & Saturday
10:00am to Midnight - Sundays
Bank Holidays extended and un-qualified other limited days

As residents of 34 years, whose house backs onto Dorking Way, we would see a significant increase in late night traffic and disturbance due to the proposed development of a pub/restaurant. In addition, the constant late night/early morning departure of noisy customers on foot, disturbing the peace of families with young children.

This would also be in addition to a rise of construction traffic during the building phase followed by deliveries once the premises opened.

Prevention of Crime and disorder

The pub/restaurant has the potential to increase anti-social behaviour especially at closing time as we have seen in Theale and at Murdochs along the Bath Road, which is now derelict.

With the location so close to the M4 we will no doubt see a rise in some undesirable visitors looking for a meeting/drop off place with easy access to a fast departure.

This has been witnessed locally where the potential for a meeting place for is created for youths to congregate as has been seen at other shops and establishments in the area where unruly behaviour has been present and so intimidating young and older residents alike.


Public Safety

We fear that car parking may cause issue when the pub car park become full, so that drivers may park along Dorking Way and other side streets, on the grass verges, blocking driveways, diminishing the line of site and causing obstructions for cyclists using the cycle lane, traffic and pedestrians, especially for young children during the day.



To whom it may concern

I PC 5787 Simon Wheeler on behalf of the Chief Officer of Thames Valley Police wish to formally object to the proposed application for a premises licence submitted by John Gaunt & Partners on behalf of Marstons PLC in relation to Calcot (New Build) Junction of Bath Road (A4) and Dorking Way, as it is believed that this application in its current format will undermine the four Licensing objectives with specific regard to that of the prevention of crime and disorder.

The proposal before the Sub-Committee is for a pub restaurant with 54 car parking spaces and it has been stated that in the order of 150 covers will be catered for with regulated entertainment being ancillary to the provision of food and alcohol.

In brief discussions with the applicant the premises has been described as a food led rotisserie restaurant with a family friendly feel.

This premises is proposed for location on the junction of the A4 Bath Road and Dorking Way which is in effect opposite the entrance to Reading Sainsburys Centre and at the edge of the Beansheaf estate, with the Fords Farm estate also close by.

The current proposed hours of operation include the supply of alcohol between till 00:00 Sun –Thurs and till 01:00 Fri – Sat.

Thames Valley Police have taken into account the applicants rationale that this is a low risk proposal due to the food led nature of the prospective business, however having undertaken our own investigation into the impact factors of the location of this premises have determined that even a “food led” business of this nature is likely to lead to or at the very least suffer levels of crime and disorder that a business of this nature may not suffer in another location.

In order to determine the impact factors that this proposed licence shall effect we have looked at the four closest licensed premises to its location which are all also “food led” and theoretically low risk premises.

Three of the four premises are within a two mile radius of the proposed premises and the fourth is within a five mile radius. (See **APPENDIX 1**)

In fairness to each of the four premises I have labelled them Pub A to Pub D but can confirm that two are Hungry Horse Restaurants, the third is classified as a Sizzling Pub and the fourth a Flaming Grill Pub.

For each of these premises I have provided a list of URN’s which are logs that are created every time the Police receive a call for service at an individual location. The log details the time of call, details of location and provides a brief precise of the initial incident/reason for the call. (see **APPENDIX 3**)

You will see from the logs which are taken from calls received between 1st January 2017 till 13th January 2018 that each of the premises have suffered a catalogue of incidents throughout this period of time and all times of the day, not just late evenings.

You may also note how similar in nature the incidents are that they are suffering from large scale fights and disorders, through to threats against staff, drug usage, concerns over issues within their car parks and potential drink driving as well as issues with elements of society that refuse to leave when refused service and remain in the premises causing security concerns for the safety of staff.

The common denominator as discussed is that all of these premises are located either on or nearby to the A4 corridor and Bath Road heading out of Reading, and that all should and would normally be considered “low risk” eateries.

However, the unfortunate situation is that for whatever reason the area for which this premises is planned for is in close proximity to a number of other premises that are all dealing with very serious issues of crime and disorder. It is for this reason that it is possible for us to predict the levels of crime and disorder and types of crime and disorder that this premises is potentially likely to apprehend.

We have also included statistics relating to the local “Calcot” Neighbourhood Police area supplied by the Police.Uk website taken from December 2016 to November 2017 and you may note that that both Anti-Social behaviour and Violence offences account for the highest percentages of crime seen within the area. It is also noted on the website that one of the main priorities for the neighbourhood team within the area is indeed anti-social behaviour and drugs (see APPENDIX 2)

Further to this the premises is planned to be situated on the edge of a residential area and as such the application for hours of operation for the supply of alcohol till 0000 hours and on weekends 0100, is also of concern in relation to the prevention of crime and disorder and public nuisance regarding potential noise and anti-social behaviour as evidenced in the statistics and problems observed at nearby premises.

In conclusion we strongly feel that this application in its current format is likely to undermine the licensing objectives. Due both to its lack of consideration for the issues apprehended at other premises of a similar nature that will likely beset this premises, as well as those observed within the local area that are detailed in the general crime statistics and supported by the local crime priority regarding anti-social behaviour and drugs.

Section 7.2 of the West Berkshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy states –

“The Licensing Authority will not operate a quota of any kind, which could pre-determine an application, nor will it seek to impose general limitations on trading hours in particular areas. Instead, regard will be given to the individual characteristics of the premises concerned. The Licensing Authority recognises that pubs, night-clubs, restaurants, hotels, theatres, and other clubs all sell alcohol, serve food and provide entertainment, but with contrasting styles and characteristics. In considering applications, proper regard will be had to these differences and the impact they are likely to have on the local community and the licensing objectives.”

In this situation this is pertinent in that the usual step would be to simply look at this premises application as that of a restaurant with low risk characteristics. However, due to the concerns that we have outlined based around the location and nature of incidents other local premises are suffering the last sentence of section 7.2 is very important when considering the impact

likely to be had by the local community and on the licensing objectives if this licence is granted.

Case law within the East Lindsey District Council v Abu Hanif establishes:-

“Importantly the prevention of crime and disorder requires a prospective consideration of what is warranted in the public interest, having regard to the twin considerations of prevention and deterrence”

Therefore in this situation our opinion is that the licensing objectives are prospective and can be preventative, and would urge the Licensing Sub-Committee to refuse this application for a premises licence in order to prevent the Licensing objectives from being undermined.

However, if the Licensing Sub-Committee were of a mind to grant this application we would strongly recommend that the following conditions be added to the operating schedule as well as a reduction of hours for the supply of alcohol to be reduced 0000 hours Sun – Thurs and Fri – Sat 0100 hours to 2300 hours Mon - Sun.

The West Berkshire Council Statement of Licensing Policy statement states:-

8.6 The Licensing Authority may impose conditions other than those consistent to the Operating Schedule or attached to the existing licence. However, they can do so only when Relevant Representations are made. For example, conditions may be attached requiring the provision or control of:

8.6.1 CCTV;

8.6.2 door staff

8.6.3 toughened glass or polycarbonate drinking glasses and restrictions on open bottles and glasses being removed from the premises;

8.6.4 drinks promotions;

8.6.5 ‘proof of age’ measures;

8.6.6 other measures intended to address the Licensing Objectives such as the playing of ambient music towards the end of an evening to reduce the possibility of violence and the handing out of sweets as people leave premises to reduce public nuisance by noise.

9.6 Generally, the Licensing Authority will consider proposed licensing hours submitted in applications for the sale and supply of alcohol and adjust these appropriately, according to Relevant Representations.

Therefore in this situation we would suggest that the reduced adjustments to the supply of alcohol hours and our recommended conditions below are all relevant representations for due consideration by the Licensing Sub-Committee in this circumstance.

Thames Valley Police believe that all of our proposed conditions are of equal weight and value to ensure that the premises licence if granted has the most robust conditions available to aid it when dealing with the incidents that are likely to occur.

However as an aside could I please also specifically draw your attention to the age verification policy that details “Challenge 25” and specifically relates to the protection of children from harm.

We note that the applicant has within their application offered to undertake a “Challenge 21” age verification policy and in a brief discussion with them it is possible that the applicant would see the “benefits across their estate” to maintain this lower standard as a reason not to implement “Challenge 25”.

We would strongly recommend that Challenge 25 is implemented by the Sub-Committee as Challenge 21 has recently been proven to be a standard which has when implemented failed to prevent the sale of alcohol to underage persons, most notably within some high profile cases involving failed test purchases in both Reading and West Berkshire.

- i) The terminal hour for cessation of alcohol on Monday to Sunday shall be 23:00 hours.

At all times that the premises is operating under this licence, the Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that its staff operate a Challenge 25 Policy (to minimise the risk of alcohol being sold to underage customers). This Policy shall (as a minimum provide) that before entry (or alternatively before any sale of alcohol), any person who appears to be under the age of 25 will be required to produce photo ID in the form of a passport; driving licence, UK Military ID card; PASS (or similar) card to prove that he/she is over the age of 18, before being permitted;

Notices advertising the Challenge 25 and proof of age policies shall be displayed in prominent places in the premises so that they can be seen internally and externally;

2) Staff training alcohol sales

Staff employed to sell alcohol shall undergo training upon induction. This training shall include, but not be limited to:-

- The premises age verification policy
- Dealing with refusal of sales
- Proxy purchasing
- Recognising valid identity documents not in the English language
- Identifying attempts by intoxicated persons to purchase alcohol
- Identifying signs of intoxication
- Conflict management
- How to identify and safeguard vulnerable persons who attend and leave the premises.
- Drug Policy and substance awareness and effects
- Search Policy
- Dispersal Policy
- Crime scene preservation
- Child Sexual Exploitation

Refresher training shall be provided every 6 (six) months and signed records made available for inspection by a Police Officer or authorised officer of West Berkshire Council upon request. These records are to be kept for a minimum of 2 (two) years of the date of training.

Prevention of Crime and disorder

3) CCTV

The premises licence holder shall ensure the premises' digitally recorded CCTV system cameras shall continually record whilst the premises are open to the public and recordings shall be kept for a minimum of 31 days with time and date stamping. The entire licensable area shall be covered by the CCTV. Data recordings shall be made immediately available to an authorised officer of Thames

Valley Police or West Berkshire Council together with facilities for viewing upon request, subject to the provisions of the Data Protection Act. Recorded images shall be of such quality as to be able to identify the recorded person in any light. At least one member of staff on the premises at any time during operating hours shall be trained to access and download material from the CCTV system.

Door Supervisors

4) The Designated Premises Supervisor shall conduct a written Risk Assessment whenever regulated entertainment is held at the premises between Monday and Sunday inclusive to establish if door staff are required. The risk assessment shall be produced to an authorised officer of West Berkshire Council or Thames Valley Police upon request.

5) When employed, a register of Door Supervisors shall be kept. The register must show the following details:

- Full SIA registration number.
- Date and time that the Door Supervisor commenced duty, countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor or Duty Manager.
- Date and time that the Door Supervisor finished work, countersigned by the Designated Premises Supervisor or Duty Manager.
- Any occurrence or incident of interest involving crime & disorder or public safety must be recorded giving names of the Door Supervisor involved.

6) The Door Supervisor register shall be kept at the premises and be available for inspection by an authorised officer of Thames Valley Police, or an authorised officer from West Berkshire Council and shall be retained for a period of six months.

7) Door Supervisors shall be clearly identifiable at all times whilst on duty and display Hi-Vis personalised armbands containing their SIA badge

Search Policy

8) An active search policy shall be put in place to prevent illegal drugs and weapons being brought on to the premises. The policy shall include, but not be limited to, methods of search, detection, confiscation and disposal and shall be actively operated. The policy shall be in written format and made available upon request to an authorised officer of West Berkshire Council and Thames Valley Police. Notices shall also be put in place informing customers that the management reserve the right to conduct an outer body search and or bag as a condition of entering the premises.

Refusals

9) All cashiers involved in the sale of alcohol shall be trained to record refusals of sales of alcohol in a refusals log (whether written or electronic). The log shall contain:

- Details of the time and date the refusal was made;
- The identity of the staff member refusing the sale;
- Details of the alcohol the person attempted to purchase.

Incident Register

10) An incident log shall be maintained to record all incidents of crime and disorder occurring at the premises. Details of occasions when the police are called to the premises shall be recorded. This log shall be available for inspection by a Police Officer or an authorised officer of West Berkshire

Council upon request and shall be retained for one year. The log shall be signed off by the Designated Premises Supervisor or nominated representative at the end of each trading session. A weekly review of the incident register shall also be carried out by the Designated Premises Supervisor.

Public Nuisance

Dispersal Policy

11) An entry, closure and dispersal policy for controlling the opening and closing of the premises and the departure of customers from the premises at the conclusion of the licensed activities shall be put in place and shall be actively operated. The policy shall be in written format and made available upon request to an authorised officer of West Berkshire Council and Thames Valley Police.

12) The licensee shall ensure that no noise shall emanate from the premises nor vibration be transmitted through the structure of the premises which gives rise to undue disturbance to local residents.

13) All [external doors / windows] must be kept closed, other than for access and egress, when events involving amplified music or speech are taking place so as not to cause disturbance to nearby residents and businesses.

14) Clearly legible and suitable notices shall be displayed at all exits requesting customers to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and area quietly.

15) The Premises and area immediately outside the premises shall be kept clear of all forms of litter whilst the premises is open for licensable activities.

Food Service

16) Substantial food shall be available at all times with Waiter and Waitress service whilst the premise is open for all Licensable activities.

Alcohol removal

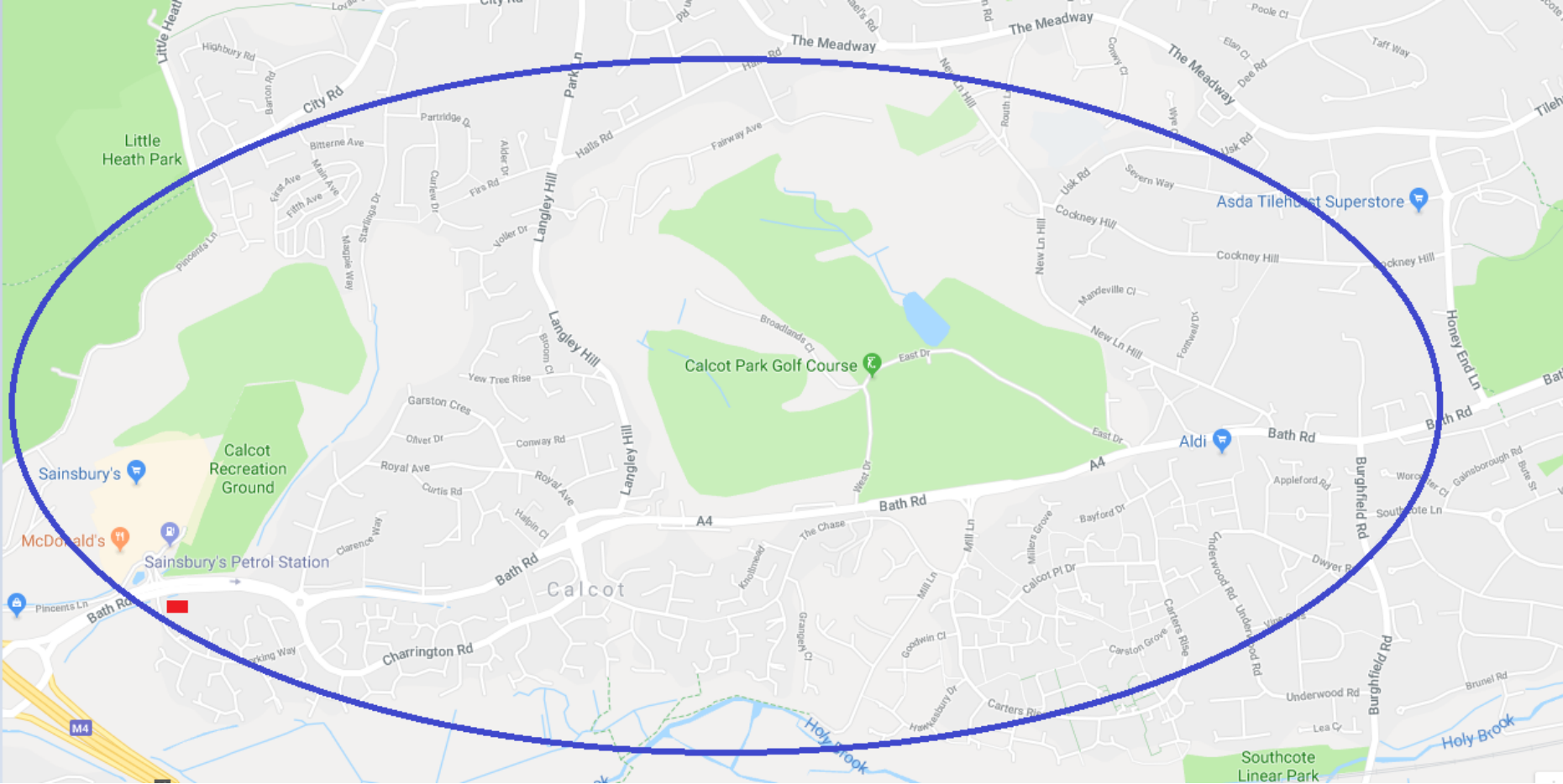
17) Customers shall not be permitted to remove open containers of alcohol or bottles from the premises.

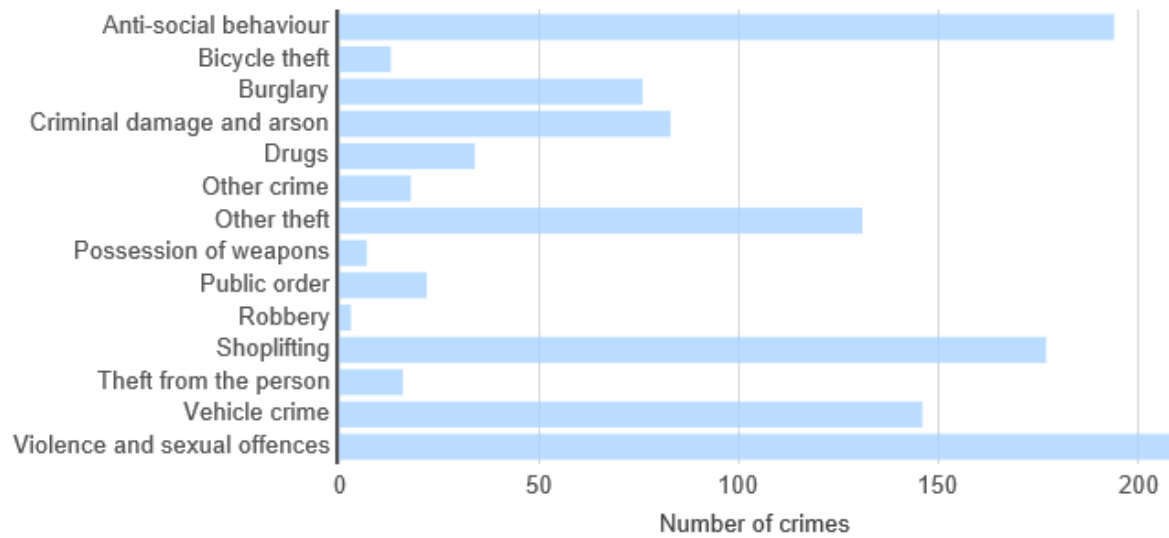
