1. Purpose of the Report

1.1 To set out the background information pertaining to this Application to vary an existing premise licence.

2. Recommendations

- 2.1 Members are asked to decide whether to:-
 - a) Grant the application to vary the premises licence as made, including the changes agreed with Thames Valley Police and Environment Health, subject to any mandatory conditions;
 - b) Grant the application to vary the premises licence, including agreed changes, subject to any additional conditions and any mandatory conditions;
 - c) Exclude from the licence any of the licensable activities to which the application to vary relates;
 - d) Refuse the application to vary the premises licence;

Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee are asked to make a decision at the end of the hearing after all relevant parties have been given the opportunity to speak. Members must give full reasons for their decision.

3. Background

- 3.1 Members of the Licensing Sub-Committee are asked to determine the Application to vary the premises licence as the Licensing Authority has received representations, which have not been withdrawn, stating that granting this application would undermine the prevention of crime and disorder, the prevention of public safety, the prevention of public nuisance, and/ or the protection of children from harm licensing objectives.
- 3.2 The Licensing Authority may only consider aspects relevant to the application that have been raised in these representations.

3.3 Where representations have been received from a responsible authority or any other person, and the concerns have not been resolved through mediation between all parties, the Licensing Act 2003 requires that these applications should be determined by the Licensing Authority's Licensing Committee. The Licensing Act 2003 allows for applications such as this one to be delegated to a Sub-Committee. In accordance with those rules, the Scheme of Delegation set out in the Council's Constitution states that the Licensing Sub-Committee has responsibility for dealing with this application.

4. Application

- 4.1 The Licensing Authority has received an Application, from Lisa Gilligan, of Freeths LLP on behalf of Aldi Stores Limited for a variation to an existing premise licence in relation to Aldi Foodstores, London Road, Newbury, RG14 1LA. This application has been recorded under reference number 21/00705/LQN.
- 4.2 A copy of the original licence is attached at Appendix 1 and the ground floor and first floor plans are attached at Appendix 2. The application to vary the premise licence is attached at Appendix 3.
- 4.3 The application is to vary a premises licence under the Licensing Act 2003. The application sought to amend the hours for the sale of alcohol for off premise consumption and opening hours to 06:00 to 00:00 every day of the week. Following discussions with Environment Health a compromise in times has been agreed. Therefore the Applicant now seeks to amend the hours for sale of alcohol and opening hours to:

Monday to Saturday: 07h00 to 23h00

Sunday: 07h00 to 22h30

4.4 The Store, under its existing licence, is permitted to supply alcohol for off premise consumption during the following times:

Supply of Alcohol

Monday to Saturday: 08h00 to 23h00

Sunday: 0h00 to 22h30

Alcohol On/Off Premises: Off Premises

Seasonal Variations:

Good Friday: 08h00 to 22h30

Christmas Day: 12h00 to 15h00 and 19h00 to 22h30

- 4.5 The premises are located towards the edge of the commercial shopping / town centre in Newbury. The local area is mixed use with offices and residential dwellings located close to these retail premises.
- 4.6 The Applicant has confirmed that the application has been submitted as part of a nationwide programme for Aldi (circa 400 stores) where the current licence has an 08h00 start time. They have also explained that the store has opened at 07h00 over the last 12 months either by virtue of a Temporary Events Notice (TEN) or simply to achieve social distancing under Covid-19 rules. They also stated that whilst there was

no intention to change the trading hours at this store an extension to the hours in the licence operating schedule would permit the flexibility required.

5. Consultation

- 5.1 The 28 day consultation period ran from 01 September 2021 to 28 September 2021. Responsible Authorities, Ward Members and the Parish Council were advised by email on the 31 August 2021. The application has been advertised in accordance with the Regulations, with the required blue notices being placed at the premises and checked by an officer from the Public Protection Partnership on the 09 September 2021 and an advert had been placed in the Newbury Weekly News on 09 September 2021.
- 5.2 Environment Health (EH) raised concerns about the proximity to residential dwellings, particularly those located opposite the Aldi Car Park and the noise impacts that they would be subjected to. The earlier and later alcohol trading hours applied for extend into the times Officers consider to be 'night-time' i.e. 23h00 to 07h00 which are times which it is reasonable and expected that most people would wish to sleep.
- 5.3 EH noted that residents would be exposed to additional noise from vehicles (engines, car stereos, and slammed doors) and the noise arising from customer trolleys during a period when lower background noise levels should be expected. Officers noted that the application did not provide any detail in the operating schedule regarding measures to prevent public nuisance and commented that it would be difficult to put in place measures which would be reasonable or successful.
- 5.4 The Applicant had taken on board these concerns and on the 12 October 2021 confirmed that they would be willing to amend the start time to 07h00 and the terminal hour as is currently (23h00 Monday to Saturday and 22h30 Sunday). Environment Health had, on this basis, agreed to withdraw their objection, allowing for review of the premises licence should nuisance complaints subsequently be received.
- 5.5 Newbury Town Council had submitted an objection following a meeting on the 13th September 2021. The submission stated that they objected to the application on the basis of the impact that it would have on local residents. (See Appendix 4)

Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Premises - Supply of Alcohol

- 1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence-
- a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
- 2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

The Licensing Act 2003 (Mandatory Licensing Conditions) (Amendment) Order 2014 (in force 1 October 2014)

3.

- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
- (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
- (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either
 - a) a holographic mark, or
 - b) an ultraviolet feature.

4.

- (1) A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- (2) For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1
 - a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979
 - b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -

$P = D + (D \times V)$

Where -

- (i) **P** is the permitted price,
- (ii) **D** is the rate of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and
- (iii) **V** is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

- c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence?
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- e) "valued added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994
- (3) Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that subparagraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- (4)
 1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - 2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule dated 30/08/2012

General

Aldi operate over 300 stores in the UK with licences free of conditions. It is submitted that as a responsible operator, selling alcohol for consumption off the premises only, no conditions need to be attached to the premises licence other than the mandatory conditions specified in the Licensing Act 2003.

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder

The applicant is a responsible retailer and takes appropriate measures to deter thieves and shoplifters. There are no other likely crime and disorder issues.

Public Safety

The applicant is a responsible retailer and takes appropriate measures to ensure the safety of those members of the public who visit the store. There are no public safety issues in particular that need to be addressed.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

The applicant is a responsible retailer and takes appropriate measures to ensure the prevention of public nuisance. It has not been an issue in any of their other stores.

The Protection of Children from Harm

The applicant is a responsible retailer and takes appropriate measures to ensure the protection of children from harm. Procedures are in place to attempt to ensure at all times that no person under the age of eighteen is sold alcohol.






