Volunteer Centre West Berkshire is the council for voluntary service for West Berkshire.

This short report is intended to provide the Health and Wellbeing Board with a glimpse of the activities that the Volunteer Centre is undertaking in order to ensure that the voice of the voluntary sector is heard within the statutory bodies.

The charity provides a range of services to the third sector and liaises with the statutory partners to include the principal and town and parish councils. In addition VCWB is a founding steering group member for the BOB ICB Voluntary Sector Alliance.

VCWB provides training, advocacy, governance advice, funding advice, partnerships advice, volunteer recruitment and information and networking events such as The Knowledge Event and V365 recruitment fairs and a weekly Voluntary Sector Bulletin reaching 950 people in the sector each week.

VCWB organises and clerks the following specialist voluntary sector voice forums. VCWB supports each chair, minutes the meetings and liaises with appropriate statutory sector officers.

Example of current issue Funding to encourage participation in the arts for well-being and finding venues which are affordable. WBC needs an arts officer as it used to have.

BHFT, West Berkshire Action for Refugees, Soup Kitchen, WBC Schools Wellbeing coordinator.

Current Issues now establishing a peer support group for survivors of those bereaved by suicide.

Community Transport Forum chaired by Garry Poulson comprising of the following groups

Current Challenges Volunteer Driver mileage rates currently set in 2011 are now significantly behind costs. The limit is having an effect on volunteer driver recruitment. A campaign amongst the groups lead by VCWB and the national community transport association is ongoing. The local MP has been forwarding our letters to the treasury but the treasury is not flexing on this important issue.

Poverty and Cost of Living HUB

The sector is facing a number challenges at this time. As might be expected the poverty and cost of living crisis affecting West Berkshire is being met by a range of excellent charities who are dealing each day with grass roots issues e.g food provision for families and individuals, homelessness, poverty. White Goods, furniture and effects. In February 2023 VCWB established the Hub at the request of WBC Public Protection Lead. The HUB meetings have now been well established with a very healthy number of attendees. The resulting meetings have contributed to the establishment of a cost of living fund provided by WBC and Greenham Trust. The fund being circa 140k. This fund is available to West Berks charities to bid into for projects that meet the needs of the communities and individuals being effected by poverty and the cost of living.

VCWB shall be preparing an update for each HWB with a focus on particular issues that partners may be able to address or assist with.
