Please provide as much information as possible to support the application (please read guidance note 2)

Thames Valley Police as a responsible authority under the Licensing Act 2003 and under the objectives of Crime and Disorder and Public Safety, make application for the review of Liquid premise license number 013407 dated 26th November 2010.

The application for the review in this respect surrounds the way in which the premises are being managed and run in terms of the Licensing Act 2003.

On 30th July 2011 a call was made to Thames Valley Police (TVP) control requesting more units to Liquid at The Kennet Centre. At 02.00 hrs a report was received at control advising that an 18 year old had been bottled, had a head injury and an ambulance was requested.

At 02.39 hrs the incident report was updated advising that paramedics were dealing with the injury to the male and that 2 individuals had been arrested for the assault and were being transported to custody.

At 02.53 hrs control were advised that things were escalating and that a large crowd would not disperse. At 03.01 hrs control was advised that the group were slowly dispersing. At 03.08 hrs control were made aware of another incident elsewhere in the Town Centre where someone had just been punched and people were now fighting. At 03.09 hrs Police were advised that the injured male was being taken to Wrexham Park Hospital and would need the skills of a plastic surgeon.

At 03.20 hrs control were advised that the main protagonists had been dispersed and that the officers had withdrawn and had established a line to separate the two fighting groups. However, there were still large amounts of people in the town centre.

At 03.33 hrs control, again, were advised that officers had established a line across the road, Reading boys trying to take on the local lads, within the report a dog handler advised that the Police Dog had occasion to bite at least 3 people, 2 of which were in the custody of the officer.

At 03.44 control were advised that all of the local lads had got into taxies and had gone. Also, that the Reading group consisting of ten males and between 6 and 7 females were walking down towards the wharf, hopefully to get taxies home.

An update of the incident was given to control and the details of which are:

At approximately 02.15 hrs the aggrieved was in the smoking area of the premise when a fight broke out during which the aggrieved was hit over the head with a bottle which had caused several deep lacerations to the head. Paramedics took the injured party to hospital where it was established that the aggrieved would require plastic surgery. The report also stated that there was the second incident at the location within a 10 to 15 minute period due to large groups of males coming from Slough, Reading and Essex for the availability of cheap alcohol through a drinks promotion.

The group that came from Reading who later caused all of the disorder admitted to officers that they had paid £3.00 each for a minibus and only had to pay £0.80 for drinks all night. They were all extremely intoxicated and appeared high on drugs.

Due to the severity of the incident the head doorman at the premise agreed with the Police to shut the premise 20 minutes early at approximately 02.40 hrs. As soon as the crowd came out into the street they were all very anti-Police and refused to leave the area.

Scuffles were breaking out all over the place, so the officer called for a running line across the street to move the people away. In additional to the numbers of Police Officers present more units arrived and together managed to disperse the crowd. It was necessary for batons and CAPTOR spray to be drawn in order to disperse the crowd.

All of this information is contained in URN 201 timed at 02.18 hrs and dated 30th July 2011. See Appendix A.

Attached are 7 witness statements taken from officers attending the incident. They report of incidents and quotes from the statemments such as:

"all persons present, without exception, were incredibly drunk";

"HIT ME TAKE ME DOWN, KILL ME, and that he was going to assault the officer and none of his equipment would do any good as he was MENTAL";

"I saw the male on the ground trying to assault a Police Dog";

"I have never seen in any Town Centre a crowd of that size so drunk and so intent on disorder. I have worked in Cities far larger than Newbury and have never seen a spontaneous disorder last so long or with those levels of violence."

"I have policed the town centre for about 8 years, the town seemed to be very busy and in my opinion from my experience of policing the town there was an unfriendly atmosphere, it was different to that of people out enjoying themselves. The majority of people I spoke to appeared intoxicated and in the whole quite abusive"

"I saw a female member of the door staff shouting we need some help in here";

"I said POLICE LET GO, but the male ignored me. i then felt something around my neck, i believed it was an arm, i then saw a door supervisor, he took hold of the male next to me and removed him from thenightclub, I believe it was the male whose arm had been round my neck";

"I put on some latex gloves and asked Jamie if I could look at his head which he agreed to. As I removed the tissue I could see two large circular wounds to his head, one of which was pumping blood, though both the wounds were bleeding heavily";

"there were males running towards us, who in my opinion, were intent on fighting and causing disorder";

"I saw a group of males leaning on the bonnet of the transit van whilst shouting things like "FUCK OFF PIGS";

"two parties shouted things towards each other like "WE HAVE GUNS IN READING, WE WILL DO YOU";

"As he lifted it up and asked if it was the pocket of the male in the rear to which I replied it was because I had seen the dog pull it off, he pulled out a small clear plasticbag which had some white powder in it"

"so I asked the head doorman if they would consider calling "time" early as it was now 02.40. I was considering asking the Duty Inspector to attend in order to close the venue down, but the head doorman agreed with me and advised that they would shut the club dowm";

"However they were stopping just outside the door and were hanging around. As I observed the persons exiting the club I noticed that all of them appeared heavily intoxicated, andwould describe others as being high on drugs";

"I shouted at the male again that if he advanced towards me I would spray him. This male was shouting "DIDN'T FUCKING CARE" and that I could "SQUIRT HIM".

"I felt the the atmosphere of the crowd had definite potential to become a large scale violent disorder":

"The crowd in front of the line were taunting us and using hand signs to show their contempt";

"I saw a group of about 15 people, mostly young white males shouting and pushing each other. I heard PS JOHNSONsay these are "Reading Boys" and the "Newbury Boys" PS JOHNSON gave the order for a new line to separate the two groups";

"The male then grabbed hold of SI Tanners arm and batton, at this point I struck the male across the back of his thighs a primary target area for my batton. I did this as the male was refusing to let go of SI Tanners baton and was inside SI Tanners defensive arc".

These are but a few of the comments made in the statements by attending Police Officers, In the statement by PC Lathe on page 2 there is a clear reference to suggest that some of the individuals were using drugs on the night, please see lines 4 "I then" to line 12 "Class A drugs". See Appendixes B1.2.3.4.5.6 and 7.

A GEN 40A was submitted outlining the incident. In the report the officer requested of one of the door supervisors to request that the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) be asked to attend the door, he did not have a clue what a DPS was and asked the head door supervisor to attend the front door who responded to the same question "what was a DPS".

This is a clear indication that the door supervisors on duty that night may not have been trainned nor registered with the SIA and given the situation there may not have been an opportunity to request their registration numbers which could have been checked at a later time. He stated that the manager was upstairs but the manager never came down. The officer advised in the report that between 30 and 40 officers were engaged in the incident. See Appendix C.

A GEN 46A was submitted by way of a report from a Special Police Sergeant who was in attendance on the night of the incident. The report contains that officers observations throught the incident from his prospective. The report includes where there was a fight at the bus station as well as elsewhere in the Town Centre. In the report there is a mention where the officer had to resort to the use of a batton on one individual as he was trying to assault another officer. See Appendix D

It transpires from an e-mail sent from the Town Centre Inspector advising that the then DPS and General Manager had been sacked and that another DPS from another location was "baby sitting" this weekend, who it seems did not want to get involved not only with the Police but the incident itself. See Appendix E.

During the evening of 15th July 2011 officers were conducting licensing checks in Newbury Town Centre and were stood outside Liquid where there were several incidents at the premise where at approximately 00.35 hrs there was an assault where 2 groups from Reading met in the premise and an altercation took place. No parties would engage with the Police, however, enough CCTV coverage of the incident was available to warrant a crime being recorded and the CCTV was viewed but insufficient information could not be obtained. Whilst downstairs outside the premise a member of the door supervisors ejected a male whoe had clearly been assaulted Sgt Bone approached the individual who was injured and tried to elicit information concerning the incident but the aggrieved was not forthcoming. Sgt Bone then engaged with a member of the door supervisors regarding the incident to obtain additional information regarding the incident whereupon the door supervisor advised that "he could not be arsed with that". Appendix F.

It was also observed that a male, who was not ejected, was seen to leave the premise so intoxicated that he had to use the wall outside the premise for support whilst attempting to light a cigarette. He attempted several times to walk off but to no avail. However, after some time he managed to stagger away. At no time did any of the door supervisors present, despite close proximately, offer any assistance to the male who may have called him a taxi to ensure his safe return home. See Appendix G.

It is evident from the information above that the premise is not being run in a manner expected from a premise aligned with a large company and it was decided that given the extreme seriousness of the incident on 30th July 2011 that the premise should be looked at in terms of the Crime and Disorder and Public Safety Objectives outlined in the Licensing Act 2003.

A analysis of incidents associated with Liquid was undertaken between 1st January 2010 and 3rd August 2011 to establish the level of incidents that required Police attention or attendance. A report was run using the Police CEDAR system and the Command & Control logs between these dates. See Appendix H.

Also, as a comparison to this report other reports were run, again, between the same dates of three premise within the area of Newbury Town Centre in order to establish which of the four premises attracted the highest degree of Police attention. See Appendixes I, J and K.

As a result of this data gathering exercise the results demonstrate for themselves which premise was, during that period, the most labour intensive in terms of Police recourses. Therefore it was necessary to do a further comparrision depicting these figures in a visible format. This was done by way of graphs using Excel. The first of these is a Bar Chart which shows the total number of crimes from CEDAR and incidents from the Command & Control logs in comparison to 3 other premises in Newbury Town Centre. See Appendix L.

In addition, a comparison has been undertaken between Liquid and the 3 other chosen venues in the Town Centre where a comparison has been completed as to during what time period the incidents of crimes from CEDAR and the Command & Control logs took place. See Appendix M.

On 5th August 2011 an E-mail was sent to the licensing officer advising that Liquids were still advertising £0.80 per drink on their website and that the price is confirmed if tickets were to be bought online. See Appendix N.

As a result on the same day the local Police Officer undertook a visit to the premises to enquire as to what was happening with regard to the drinks promotion that was being advertised on the website for Friday night. The DPS agreed with the officer that the advertising had to be removed in order to make it plain to customers that this promotionwould not be taking place. See Appendix O.

CCTV coverage of the incident was seized and a stock of photographs have been taken from the footage. See Appendix P and Q.

A special constable attended St Bartholomews School to collect his "A" Level results. Whilst leaving the school he was approached by a female who he believes was in her early twenties wh had a bundle of flyers in her hand and said something in the order of Can I give you one of theses which the officer accepted. It was an advertisment for an "A" level results party. The female did not enquire if the officer was over 18. See Appendix R.

Thames Valley Police are requesting the Revocation of the Premises Licence for what can be clearly seen as a premise that is responsible for the largest number of incidents within what is primarily a Market Town and not an inner city where the level of incidents shown could be expected. The management of the venue do not consider the afore mentioned licensing objectives as something that is their resonnsibility to uphold.

The corporate policy, which has been in place for some time, demonstrates that footfall into the premise is the primary goal for a lot of it's venues no matter which brand it is marketed under. Nor take any remidial action in respect of the following:

- 1. The failure by the management to meet the Prevention of Crime and Disorder due to the number of incidents and crimes linked to the premise.
- 2. The unacceptable high levels of incidents relating to intoxication within the premises and incidents of the same outside the premise.
- 3. The failure to support the Public Safety objective due to the high levels of incidents involving injury likely to cause alarm and distress to passing members of the public.
- 4. The failure to meet the Public nusisance objective due to the levels of anti social behaviour linked to the premise.
- 5. The encouraging of the excess consumption of alcohol.
- 6. And continue to advertise a drinks promotion on their website which would have undoubtly led to a further serious disorder given the last incident and the extreemly serious situations that has been experienced around the country.

If this is not considered appropriate then the following option is:

The premise license be suspended for up to a maximum period of three months in order to re-establish its responsibilities under the Crime and Disorder and Public Safety Objectives and to operate the premise in a more proficient, professional, and a safe environment for members of the public to enjoy and to re-assure other members of the public that the area is not a place to be caught in but is in all respects a Market Town.

- 1. The closing time shall reduce to 0200 hours, Monday to Sunday inclusive.
- 2. All incidents which impact on any of the four licensing objectives shall be recorded in a register kept at the premises for this purpose. The names of the person recording the incident and those members of staff who deal with any incident shall also be recorded. Where known, any offenders name shall also be recorded.
- 3. There is put into place a well trained and experienced manager to control the running of the premises and who would be trusted to support the licensing objectives.
- 4. The staff at the premises be trained every three month in the responsible selling of alcohol, be able to recognised when someone has had enough to drink of if not seek the advice of a member of staff who can. This training is to be documentated and be made available to an authorised member of West Berkshire Council or any authorised Officer of Thames Valley Police at all reasonable times.
- 5. There shall be no alcohol or soft drinks either in glass or polycarbornate vessles persmited in the smoking area.

The line was one Officer deep. A lot of people came at the lines and me personally I do not remember how many people I pushed away. I saw every Officer of the line at which this point may have been almost 20 – 25 Officers engaged with aggressive members of the public. All persons present almost without exception were incredibly drunk and aggressive. I believe this to be because LIQUID NIGHTCLUB was selling any alcoholic drink for 80pence. Most if not all of the persons involved appeared to have come from LIQUID and certainly from immediately outside it. I had my baton in my right hand as I pushed people away from me. As I was holding my position at the left of centre line I became aware of the dog handler being either next to me or two Officers down the line. I heard every Officer present shouting loudly GET BACK MOVE, GET OFF, GO AWAY. At one point or an other I said all of these things and on occasion I was dealing with a very large bald man in a black shirt who was screaming at me he would 'HIT ME, TAKE ME DOWN, KILL ME' and numerous other insults I remember grabbing hold of him pushing him away from me and shouting 'FUCK OFF' I did this because I had already shouted at him to move numerous times politely and he had stared at me told me he would assault me and that none of my equipment would work on him because he was 'MENTAL'. I pushed him lots of times very hard in an effort to get him to walk away from the lines and my self. I also saw numerous other Officers do the same. I was also approached as were lots of Officers by a white male in an Orange T-SHIRT he approached me numerous times shouting 'COME ON THEN, MOVE ME' I had to push him away lots of times, every time I made contact with his chest which is how I pushed him away he shouted 'THAT'S ASSAULT' This male did the same thing to numerous Officers and I believe was arrested later on I did not see when or by who. Whilst helping another Officer push someone away I heard the Police dog bark loudly and the bald dog handler who I don't know shout loudly and repeatedly 'BACK OFF, GET BACK FUCK OFF, GO AWAY.' Initially I couldn't see who he was talking to I looked away then saw 4-5 Officers including PC SMITH scuffling with a white male in what I think was a white v neck t-shirt. I then saw the Police Dog move in a bite this male to one of his legs I do not remember which leg. I then saw PC SMITH take the male to the floor. This male was clearly re-acting violently and was struggling with Officers he was screaming loud obscenities, I couldn't make out what as I was very close to lots of people who were screaming at me and every other Officer. I saw PC SMITH put this male to the ground and I made to walk over to assist him and the other Officers as I got close I did have my baton raised I didn't however strike this male because the dog was in the way and there were enough Officers I did however shout to PC SMITH to 'MOVE YOUR HAND MATE, MOVE YOUR ARM' I did this because the Police Dog who was biting this males leg was moving very close to PC SMITHS arm. I saw the male on the floor at one point try and punch the Police Dog. After I had shouted to PC SMITH I immediately turned and advanced a few metres forward as did the rest of the line. On doing this I did not see what happened further to this male until after pushing the same male in the black shirt! had earlier

shouted at away I turned back and saw PC 5977 LATHE and another female Officer knelt near the male. I again was immediately engaged by other members of the public so had to look away. On looking back a few seconds later I saw Inspector WARREN stand the male up and put handcuffs on him in the back to back Position and lead him away with a larger bald SGT who was probably SGT HAWKETT however I did only see the SGT from behind.

The disorder continued for about an hour and we steadily pushed the aggressive crowd around towards the MARKET PLACE. I have never seen in any town centre a crowd of that size so drunk and so intent on disorder. I have worked in Cities far larger than NEWBURY and have never seen a spontaneous disorder last so long or with those levels of violence. This incident was clearly alcohol fuelled and almost everyone I came into contact with including the rare compliant people were utterly drunk. I cannot name any of the individuals involved as this was a large scale violent disorder and I was concentrating far more on keeping my self and colleague's safe then getting peoples details. It would not have been practical for any Officers to take names or details of anyone. It was a very loud aggressive fast moving situation, I did use force on numerous people as did all Officers present. I feel any force I used was proportionate and necessary in the circumstances. It mostly consisted of simply pushing people away from myself and Police lines. On perhaps three occasions I did push people to the chest with my baton held in both hands racked, I held it horizontally and pushed outwards aiming to make contact with peoples chest or abdomen, I only did this after having given numerous warnings and asking them to back off or move and only to the people who were coming forward to clearly engage us in a violent manner. At all times I was asking them to move away and back off and leave the area. At numerous points during the incident I remember being confronted by a white male in an orange t-shirt. He was medium build, had dark hair and was particularly verbally abusive. He refused numerous times to move away and disperse and kept approaching the police line in an aggressive manner. At one stage I pushed him away and he just kept coming back at me so I ended up pushing him repeatedly whilst walking towards him in an effort to make him back away from both the line and my self. I saw this male approach at least another five or six Officers in the same loud and aggressive manner and be pushed away from them. This male also approached the Dog handler who I heard, shout loudly and repeatedly 'LEAVE, GET BACK AWAY' I don't know this male but I remember him in particular because when I looked down the Police line he was almost always at the front shouting and being pushed back by Officers. Throughout the incident we were given clear instructions as to when to advance the line and when to draw batons, I heard loud verbal commands being given by Sgt 4256 JOHNSON who I believe was there before I arrived and appeared to be in good control of the Police Line. Inspector WARREN arrived afterward and prior to placing handcuffs on the male who was bitten by the Police dog the inspector was also issuing orders and liaising with PS Johnson.

I am Acting Special Sgt 8308 ASHMAN of Thames Valley Police currently based at Newbury Police
Station. On Friday 29 th July 2011 I was on duty in full uniform, with SC 8210 LUCKETT, we were using
the call sign FAN20 and were tasked with foot patrol in Newbury Town Centre.
I have policed the town centre for about 8 years, the town seemed to be very busy and in my opinion
from my experience of policing the town there was an unfriendly atmosphere, it was different to that of
people out enjoying themselves. The majority of people I spoke to appeared intoxicated and in whole
quite abusive.
I became aware that Liquid Nightclub on Market Street, Newbury were extremely busy and by about
0100hrs on Saturday 30 th July they had had about 600 people through their door. This is an unusual
amount of people for a Friday night and I believed it was because they were doing a drinks promotion of
80pence per drink.
At about 0130hrs I was stood outside the night club, talking to a member of door staff who I know to be
Oliver CHAPPLE, there was another doorman with him, though I don't know his name.
I then saw both members of door staff run into the premise, a couple of minutes later I saw a female
member of door staff approaching the front door, she appeared flustered and shouted "WE NEED SOME
HELP IN HERE". I asked SC LUCKETT to accompany me inside to assess what was happening, asking
SC HARVEY and his crew mate to wait outside. As I entered the night club I proceeded to walk up the
stairs, as I turned the corner, I saw approximately 15 people having an altercation, amongst the people
were members of door staff who appeared to be struggling to remove the people from the stair case. I
shouted "POLICE" then took hold of a male whose back was towards me, he was throwing punches
towards another male on the stairs, though none connected that I saw. As I took hold of the males left
arm, he clung on to the railing with his right arm. I said "POLICE, LET GO", but the male ignored me. I
then felt something around my neck, I believed it was an arm, I then saw

of a male next who was next to me and removed him from the nightclub, I believe it was this male whose arm had been round my neck.

I then saw SC LUCKETT with a male who was on the ground and he appeared to be placing him in handcuffs. I was then aware that another fight was happening so I ran outside and down Market Street, I saw a male who was bleeding from his nose, he told me he had been punched, though refused to give me his details or to tell me who had hit him.

Having dealt with the male I returned to Liquid and spoke to the time was about 0200hrs, he told me there were still about 450 people inside the venue. All the members of the Special Constabulary were due to go off duty at 0200hrs, I liaised with Special Inspector TANNER and told her that in my opinion we should stay until 0300hrs when the club was due to close, as I felt there was a high chance of there being more trouble. The people leaving the venue were all intoxicated and were being abusive towards police, I gave out several warnings regarding inappropriate language throughout the course of the evening.

Special Sergeant HARVEY was then tasked with contacting the duty sergeant PS JOHNSON, which he did, he informed him about the problems we had been dealing with at Liquid, told him that we would be staying on duty until 0300hrs and also asked for some more officers to join us as we felt there may be more disorder.

At about 0210hrs I was stood by the entrance to Liquid, when I saw a young male walking down the stairs, accompanied by a female member of door staff. She took him to the medical room though there was already somebody being treated in it, so I heard her tell him to wait outside. I was very concerned about the male's welfare as he appeared to be covered in blood. I asked into the club to check on the male, which he agreed to. I then told him that due to the amount of blood I felt the male must have a significant injury and asked him to empty the medical room so that I could take the male into it to assess his injuries. The male already in the room had a small cut to his forehead so he was taken outside and the other male taken in.

As I entered the medical room, I saw a male I now know to be the same of the was wearing jeans and a t-shirt, both of which were saturated in blood. He was holding some blue tissue to the right hand side of his head and had blood running down his face. I put on some latex gloves and asked Jamie if I could look at his head which he agreed to. As I removed the tissue I could see two large circular wounds to his head, one of which was pumping blood, though both wounds were bleeding heavily. I immediately placed the issue back onto his head an applied pressure to the wounds. I then asked for an ambulance as a priority as I believed the male had a significant head injury. SI TANNER then informed me she had called an ambulance. I then opened two large dressings that were in the medical room and placed them onto the wounds, keeping pressure applied. I then checked the rest of Jamie's body, to ensure that he

didn't have any other injuries. Throughout I was talking to Jamie, as I didn't want him to lose consciousness. He told me that a male had hit him with a bottle to the head, he described the male as a white male, in his early 20's with spikey hair, he told me that the male had a tattoo on both sides of his neck, which he believed was a symbol each side, though he thought that one of the tattoos may have been an "N" or had the letter in it. I noticed that one of the wounds was still bleeding heavily and I called up on the police radio asking for a unit to bring me another large dressing and also for the ambulance to be chased up. There was a pool of blood by Jamie's feet and I was very concerned about the amount of blood he was losing. PC 4425 DANKS then brought me a large dressing, I kept my hand on the wound and placed the dressing around it, so that I could keep as much pressure applied to the wound as possible. (Replace) kept telling me that he was tired and wanted to go to sleep, so I kept making him talk to me, as I wanted him to stay awake. told me that he had been out with his grandfather during the day and had drunk two pints with him. He then said he had drunk about another seven pints whilst in the nightclub. was also present, though I don't know his name. He was clearly upset about his brothers injuries and was a little irate, due to this I asked SI Tanner to take him outside as I wanted to keep Jamie as calm as possible. About 15-20minutes after I had started treating Jamie, the ambulance arrived. They assessed injuries and informed me that he needed to go to Wexham Park Hospital in Slough as that was were the nearest plastic surgeon was. I was then made aware that the club was closing and as I opened the door to the medical room there were a lot of people exiting the club. I then escorted Jamie to the ambulance and went inside with him. I wrote down what Jamie had told me in my pocket notebook and he then signed it. He then gave me his mum, and asked me to tell her what had happened. I then left the ambulance to liaise with Sgt Johnson, to see if I needed to do anything else before the ambulance left, a few minutes later the ambulance left. In my opinion Jamie's injuries were consistent with him being hit to the head twice with a bottle. The circular shape of the injuries were about the size of the large end to a glass bottle that are sold within the venue. I was then aware of a large amount of people crowded around Market Street, they all seemed to be very hostile towards the police officers on scene and I could small fights breaking out down the road. All the police officers then formed a line across the road, I was at the end of the line to the left hand side, closest to the cinema, I was aware that there was also a police dog present. The crowd was very large, in my opinion there were several hundred people there. Many of the crowd were very hostile, they were shouting abusive towards all the officers and several of them were running towards us. I drew my baton. as did other officers, due to the fact I felt that the group could become violent. I shouted at the people in front of me "GET BACK" and "GO HOME". A lot of the group were there to watch and did show any resistance, though there were males running towards us, who in my opinion, were intent on fighting and causing disorder. a blue shirt. He was shouting abuse at me and refusing to move as the line of police officers moved forward. The male appeared to be intoxicated, he was ignoring all my commands and continued to shout abuse towards police officers. I told him to "GET BACK" as he approached me, though he didn't, show I used a double palm strike to his chest to push him backwards to create space between us. At all times my baton was drawn, though I didn't use it to strike anybody.

I then saw a group of about 7 males, on the bonnet of the police transit van, they were leaning against it whilst shouting things like "FUCK OFF PIGS" towards us. The line of officers continued to move forward, making the members of the public move in the direction of the Market Place, slowly groups of people started to disperse, though there was still a large amount of people there refusing to move and showing aggression towards the police. I then saw a male in a yellow t-shirt running towards the line of police officers, waving his arms around, he was the other side of the road to me, so my view was obstructed at times, though I then saw Police dog BASCO, bite the male to his leg and the next thing I saw was the male being restrained on the floor by officers. As we turned the corner on Market Street, more and more people began to disperse and leave the area. Again directly in front of me was a male, who was ignoring the commands of "GET BACK". The male kept walking towards me, so again I used a double palm strike to create space between myself and him. On the direction of Inspector Warren the line of officers held their position near to the junction of Bear Lane and Market Street, the majority of the main people causing the disturbance had gone into the Market Place.

As we separated the two parties they started shouting things towards each other like "WE HAVE GUNS IN READING, WE WILL DO YOU". Slowly the two groups dispersed and Sgt JOHNSON told me I could return to the Police Station to complete paperwork. As SC LUCKETT and I walked down BEAR LANE, I saw a white min bus parked

by the rear of the QUEENS HOTEL. The males who I believed where from Reading were getting onto the bus. I called up on the radio and informed Sgt Johnson of this. I then walked under the underpass towards the police station, as I came out the other side, I saw the same mini bus stopping on Mill Lane, when I heard a loud bang, and it appeared the males were fighting on the bus. I called for another unit to assist me, whilst the bus driver was pulling people out the bus. All the individuals on the bus were intoxicated and still being abusive towards the police. I then heard the bus driver say he would take the males, if they calmed down and behaved themselves. I then heard PC WESTON tell the males to behave and go home, or if there was anymore disorder that they would all be arrested. The bus then went on its way and I returned to the police station to complete my paperwork.

In all of my eight years service, I have never known such a large scale disorder in Newbury Town Centre. Throughout I was fearful for my welfare and for that of my colleagues, as we were very outnumbered by a very hostile group of intoxicated individuals.

This statement relates to an incident of Grievous Bodily Harm in the early hours of this morning at Liquid
Nightclub, Market Street, Newbury, Berkshire.
At approximately 0220 hours this morning Saturday 30 th July 2011 I attended Liquid Nightclub, Newbury
at the above address, following a report from officers already present at the scene that a male had been
hit over the head with a bottle. Upon my arrival I parked my marked police astra car on the delivery ramp
immediately outside the front of Liquid. I saw several police cars and a police transit van parked in the
road with numerous officers stood at various points nearby. I also saw a couple of police officers talking
to a group of people immediately on my right just near to the entrance/exit door of Liquid.
I walked up to the entrance of Liquid and spoke to the single doorman who was present. I asked him
where the Designated Premise Supervisor (DPS) was, to which his reply to me was "ITS MY FIRST"
NIGHT, I DON'T HAVE A CLUE WHAT A DPS IS". This doorman then used his radio to ask the "head
doorman" to come to the front door. Whilst I was waiting for him to attend I made my way into the
nightclub, to the medical room which is situated up a flight of stairs on the right. The door to the medical
room was closed with numerous people stood outside the door on the stairs. No door staff was visible to
me at all, apart from the single one stood on the front door. I made my way past the crowd of people on
the stairs and entered the medical room, where I saw Special Sergeant MUNRO-ASHMAN applying
pressure to a dressing that she had applied to the head of a male who was clearly bleeding profusely.
Also present in the medical room was Special Inspector TANNER and an unknown male who I assumed
was a friend of the male who had been hit over the head. This male was extremely intoxicated and
agitated. He kept saying things like "IF YOU DON'T DO ANYTHING ABOUT THIS THEN I WILL". I told
the male to clam down as did S/Insp TANNER. I was stood about a meter away and spoke to the injured
male and asked him if he could tell me what happened. I had no physical contact with the injured person
at all. He stated he had been in the smoking area of Liquid night club, and a fight had started during

had assaulted him, to which he replied his attacker was white with short dark hair. He had a tattoo on each side of his neck, and was wearing a white shirt which may have had some writing on it. Due to the nature of the location and incident I did not have suitable time to record this description in my pocket note book, but I was advised by S/Sgt MUNRO-ASHMAN that she had already documented this. I then exited the medical room, as I did so I saw PC TOVEY and PC POLDEN coming down the stairs heading towards the exit with two males in handcuffs. Again I noted that there were no security staff from Liquid to be seen anywhere and were certainly not assisting PC's TOVEY and POLDEN. I immediately noticed that the male PC POLDEN had arrested was wearing a white shirt with writing on it, and that he was a white male with short dark hair. I followed these officers outside and spoke to PC's TOVEY and POLDEN. As I stood about two metres away from the officers, I had a closer look at the male with PC POLDEN and saw that he also had a tattoo on each side of his neck. I advised PC POLDEN that the male he had arrested matched the description given to me by the aggd. Both of these males were then lead away to the police transit van and out of my sight. I had no physical contact with either of these males, and no further dealings with either of them after that. I then turned and walked back into Liquid to speak to the door staff again. This time there was a second male present at the door who identified himself to me has the "head doorman" but he did not tell me his name. I asked this male if I could speak to the DPS, to which his reply was also "WHATS A DPS". I explained who I wanted to speak to and he informed me that the manager was upstairs looking at the cctv. I asked him if he could get the manager to come down to speak to me.

I was aware that this was the second incident inside the nightclub within about 30 minutes. Only a short time ago police units had called up asking for more police assistance due to a fight at the location. Due to the nightclub's drink promotion this evening of 80 pence a drink all night long I could clearly see numerous heavily intoxicated persons inside with very few security staff on duty. PC's TOVEY and POLDEN had to enter the main nightclub area looking for the persons responsible for the assault without any assistance from security. No security staff had offered any form of medical assistance to the male with the head injury, nor did they support the two offices who were isolated inside the medical room. For these reasons I formed the opinion that the security staff and management at Liquid did not have proper control of the venue so I asked the head doorman if they would consider calling "time" early as it was now 0240 hours. I was considering asking the Duty Inspector to attend in order to close the venue down, but the head doorman agreed with me and advised that they would shut the club down and not allow any more persons to enter the club. I made my way outside the front door to wait for the manager, but no manager ever came down to speak to me.

A short time later whilst I was stood outside I became aware that people had now started to leave the nightclub. However they were stopping just outside the door and were the then hanging around. As I

observed the persons exiting the club I noticed that all of them appeared to be heavily intoxicated, and would describe others as being high on drugs. I observed several males and females being sick immediately outside on the pavement, and remember seeing one girl who was so drunk it was taking 3 of her friends to hold her up. I also noticed several large groups of males exiting the club. These males seemed to take an instance dislike to the police presence and started being verbally abusive to police and other members of the public. I then saw a small fight break out immediately behind the ambulance that now had the injured male inside. This was broken up by police but less than 2-3 minutes later I saw a second fight break out by the wall of the "Kennet centre". I would estimate that at this time there was between 400-500 people on the street many of whom were being abusive, with small fights breaking out all over the place. I asked the local CCTV to confirm that they were watching and recording what was happening, and then organised the police who were present on the scene into a "line" across the road starching from the Kennet Centre over to the bus station. My intention was to try and disperse the crowd down MARKET STREET, round towards the MARKET PLACE where there would be numerous taxis etc. that could start to take them away. I was also trying to ensure the safety of the ambulance, its crew and the injured male. I then used by police radio to advise control room that the situation had escalated and asked for more police units to come to assist. Due to the limited number of police officers present I joined the police "line" along with several members of security staff who had arrived from some of the other town centre venues. I used my open hand to push people away all the time issuing clear instructions asking them to walk away and move back from the police line. I saw one male being pushed away from the line by another officer, and then saw this same male swing his arm at the officer almost hitting them. Less than a minute later I saw the same aggressive male appear in front of me. I shouted at him to move away and go home. This male continued to come towards me so I drew my "captor" spray and held it in a high profile position. I shouted at the male again that if he advanced towards me I would spray him. This male was shouting that he "DIDN'T FUCKING CARE" and that I could "SQUIRT HIM". This male began to advance towards me, but before I could spray him another male appeared behind him, got him into a "bear hug" and dragged him away. This male was stocky, wearing a black t-shirt, with short or shaved hair and was heavily tattooed on both arms. The male who dragged him away was older, fatter and bald. I then became aware that Insp WARREN the duty inspector had arrived on the scene. I quickly briefed him on what had happened and what my intention was. Further police units arrived which increased the strength of the police line. Along with other officers I drew my baton and held it in a high profile position. The instruction was then given by the Insp to advance the police line to disperse the crowd from the street. As we slowly advanced we were continually being verbally abused, and met with continued resistance. The people were refusing to move away, and were actively resisting our attempts to push them up the street. I saw numerous males continue to advance towards the police line, who had

to be physically pushed and shouted at to get them to move back. This process continued for some time as the police line slowly advanced trying to disperse the crowd. We slowly pushed the large crowd back along MARKET STREET, into CHEAP STREET and up towards the MARKET PLACE. I was aware that was we advanced, the local CCTV operator kept calling up to report more fights breaking out all over the place in the MARKET PLACE. Due to the sheer size of the crowd, their hostility towards police and the limited police numbers it was not safe to try and advance further in order to break these fights up. We held the police line on CHEAP STREET, outside the POST OFFICE and remained static whilst the crowd slowly dispersed into taxis etc home. After being stood here for about 10-15 minutes the duty Inspector stood half the police officers down to resume to other commitments. I remained on scene together with 9 other officers to monitor the remaining 100 or so persons still in the market place. We again saw another fight break out in the MARKET PLACE so I advanced together with the other officers and put another police line across the road outside the "CORN EXCHANGE" in order to separate the two groups of males. One of the officers with me informed me that his cousin or friend was part of the group we had just separated so I spoke to this male. He did not give me his name but when I asked where he was from and why he was in Newbury he advised he that there was a minibus full of him and his friends from Reading. The had each paid £3.00 for the minibus fare from Reading to Newbury because of the 80 pence a drink all night long at Liquid. It was cheaper for them to do this to come to Newbury to get intoxicated than it was to go out in Reading. This group of about 15-20 persons from Reading continued to hang around the Market Place looking for a fight with local youths. After about 20 minutes they started to disperse as it was time for the minibus to collect them. I allowed them to walk over towards BARCLAYS BANK, (a) because they were getting out of the town and (b) in the 20 minutes we had been stood there the local youths had gone. I then tasked two units with following this minibus until all of them had left the area. By this time it was approx 0420 hours so this whole incident had taken nearly two hours to resolve. Because of the disorder that had happened it had not been possible for me to allocate an officer to seize the cctv of the original assault in Liquid. I did dispatch a unit back around there at this time, but the premise was all locked up for the night with no staff on scene. I then returned to Newbury Police Station where by I completed a Gen40A report to the licensing officer. I ensured that I completed this report before going home because in my opinion this whole incident was as a direct result of Liquid nightclub holding an 80 pence a drink promotion night, whilst also having insufficient security staff to control the venue. This promotion caused people from all over the area to attend the venue with the intention of getting extremely drunk very cheaply. This statement was made at 1800 hours today, which was as soon as was practical after the incident. It was made whilst the incident details are still fresh in my memory and forms my original notes.

On Friday 29 th July 2011 I was on duty in full uniform crewed with Special Constable 9114 HOLLIS. I was tasked with running operation Folk in Newbury town centre for the special constabulary. I had five special constables plus myself in the town.
At approximately 0100 hrs myself, SC HOLLIS, SS ASHMAN, SC LUCKETT were stood outside LIQUID nightclub on Market street Newbury. Liquid had a 80 pence any drink promotion on which attracted approximately 450 people to the premise. Myself and the other special constables were made aware by door staff of an incident that was happening inside the nightclub where males were fighting. Myself and SC Hollis waited outside while SS Ashman and SC Luckett went inside to assist door staff. I called up over my personal radio to request more units due to the number of people fighting and Liquid only had five members of door staff on duty. All the persons who were fighting were separated and ejected from the nightclub. All persons involved were extremely intoxicated. None of the persons fighting wanted to make any complaints to police and due to no persons seeing who started the fight or who hit who the groups were sent on their separate ways.

with the incident while myself and SC Luckett were made aware of a fight happening in the bus station opposite Liquid.

As we approached one of the males had ran off in the direction of the Council car park. The male that stayed was extremely intoxicated and did not want to make any complaint to police. SC Luckett took the males details and the male got into a taxi and left the area. I then heard over my personal radio SS Ashman call for more units to attend as we had a potential GBH.

Myself and SC Luckett made our way over to Liquid to assist. PS Johnson had also arrived at Liquid and ordered the nightclub to close. I did notice that a traffic unit and a dog unit had arrived on scene.

As the customers were coming out of Liquid I was stood with door staff at the front of the premise and tried to move them away from the front doors so we didn't have a big crowd gathering in the entrance. Whilst I was doing that I noticed two females fighting over by the cycle rack next to the Kennet Centre door 7. Myself and other officers made our way over there as there was a large group gathering around these two females. We had to push people in the crowd out the way as they were obstructing us from getting to the females.

Once we got to the females they had already stopped fighting and were being taken away in separate directions. Both females were extremely intoxicated.

The next thing I can recall happening is a large group of the males being very anti towards myself and other officers by refusing to move on and disperse from the area. PS Johnson then made the call to form a line of police officers to try and push the group around to the market place. I can recall a male in a yellow t-shirt coming up very close to me demanding my shoulder number, the male was extremely drunk and abusive, as the male got close to me I gave him a very loud verbal command to move on and disperse to which he ignored. I then open palmed pushed the male away.

I then saw other officers drawing their baton so I drew mine. I can then recall SI pushing a IC1 male away from her with her baton. The male then grabbed hold of SI Tanners arm and baton, at this point I struck the male across the back of his thighs a primary target area with my baton. I did this as the male was refusing to let go of SI Tanners baton and was inside SI Tanners defensive ark. The male was extremely intoxicated and abusive towards her. This had an instant effect as the male let go of SI Tanner. I then lost sight of the male as he was dragged away by other members of the group. I cannot recall what the male looked like or what he was wearing.

This statement relates to a large scale public order incident which occurred on SATURDAY 30 th JULY							
2011 in NEWBURY town centre between LIQUID NIGHTCLUB and THE MARKET PLACE.							
On Saturday 30 th July 2011at about 0220hrs whilst in full uniform including high visibility jacket and flat							
hat and crewed with PC BAKER 6883 I heard PS JOHNSON 4256 update control that LIQUID nightclub							
had a large number of drunk people in the street. I point to pointed PS JOHNSON and suggested that							
PC BAKER and I attend in the VIVARO van as the POLICE transit was en route back to custody with a							
prisoner. At approximately 0230hrs I drove in to MARKET STREET and saw a very large crowd of about							
200 people around LIQUID which had spilled in to the road, the bus station and past the VUE cinema. I							
could see officers were dotted within the crown trying to disperse them. I exited the van and located PS							
JOHNSON who instructed me to assist to disperse the crowd. I felt that the atmosphere of the crowd							
had definite potential to become a large scale violent disorder. There were officers in the road shouting							
at drunken people telling them to "MOVE ON" many of these people were refusing to leave shouting at							
officers and refusing to leave. I began to try and disperse members of the crowd who looked like they							
were looking for trouble. Telling them and then shouting at them to "MOVE", when they refused I pushed							
these people to the chest telling them forcefully to "MOVE ON". All officers were using the same tactics							
but due to the size of the crowd and the intention of some of its members there were little results.							
Officers were dispersed within the front of the crowd and I had a fear that the situation could get out of							
control. I heard PS JOHNSON shout to "FORM A LINE" about half of the officers at this point consisted							
of special constables. I passed on the order to form a line and instructed some of the special constables							
on what to do. A line was quickly formed as per PS JOHNSONS orders which stretched from the							
entrance to VUE cinema across the road to the bus station facing away from LIQUID. This line consisted							
of about 15 officers all in full PPE. We held the line for about 5 minutes whilst the stragglers from the

FORWARD" with this I passed the order shouting "MOVE FORWARD". The crowd in front of the line were taunting us and using hand signs to show their contempt for police. The Police transit van was parked outside a shop 30 meters ahead to the right near to GHASSANS kebab shop. About 8 members of the crowd were in front of the van posing for photos. In addition to some of the crowd appearing to be there just to have fun I identified some more serious members who appeared intent on causing disorder. Special constable LUCKETT 8210 was stood to my right with special sergeant HARVEY 8620 trying to move a male who I recognised as was wearing a yellow tee-shirt with some writing on the front and blue jeans. was shouting at the special constables "IM NOT MOVING!" SC LUCKETT warned numerous times to move on and then pushed him backwards with both hands palm out to his chest, at which point moved forwards again in to SC LUCKETTS face shouting "THAT'S ASSAULT" was causing a problem for another 20 or 30 feet as the line was moving with the same attitude. I also had dealings with being forced to push him away from the line. The moved across the line trying the same thing with a number of officers again shouting "THAT'S AN ASSAULT" when he was eventually pushed away many times. Due to the scale of the public order and the numbers involved it was not practical for officers to arrest for anything other than serious offences. When the line reached the corner of MARKET STREET junction with CHEAP STREET I saw a tall white male with a white shirt moving up and down the line shouting at officers. He was being told to "MOVE ON" but was refusing. Police dog handler PC2198 BUSHNELL was behind the line with his dog throughout. The line continued to move and spread out as officers were required to go hands on with a few crowd members and I saw that the line was starting to break up. To my right I saw the male in the white shirt grappling with a police officer, as I turned to move in towards him other officers started to try and push him away. His back was towards me as he was now effectively in the police line, I grabbed him by his shoulders and took him to the ground. At the same time I saw the police dog take hold of the males trouser near his hip. I still had my hands on the male's shoulders and I heard an officer shout "WILL MIND YOUR HANDS" I let go and saw that the male was under control with officers holding him. I turned and reformed back in to the line which was still broken but the crowd having seen the dog in action began to withdraw. The line held for a few more minutes and I saw 15meters to my right shouting at PC BUSHNELL and his dog. PC BUSHNELL was shouting "GET BACK OR YOULL GET THE DOG" WATKINS puffed out his chest and gestured to himself saying "GO ON THEN". PC BUSHNELL warned WATKINS a few more times but was still defiant and refusing to move. PC BUSHNELL then directed his dog at the bush and briefly grabbed on to WATKINS jeans near to his waistline and PC BUSHNELL immediately withdrew the dog. on to his rear and got back up and shouted something like "IS THAT ALL YOU"VE GOT?" the line began to move forwards again and many members of the crowd were filming with their mobile phones. continued t move until adjacent with THE DIAMOND TAP when 2 door staff members joined in the line next to me to make up the numbers that were lost dealing with and the male in the white shirt. To the left I saw officers dealing with a male who had picked up a temporary road sign and was trying to throw it, the line continued to move forwards until most had been dispersed from the area. The main trouble makers from the crowd moved in to and around the market place. We held the line next to the post office for a further 10 minutes until the line was stood down by Inspector WARRAN. A few minutes later town centre CCTV called in a large fight in the MARKET PLACE and we were deployed. As we arrived in the MARKET PLACE I saw a group of about 15 people, mostly young white males shouting at and pushing each other. I heard PS JOHNSON say that these were the "Reading boys" and the "Newbury Boys" PS JOHNSON gave the order for a new line to separate the 2 groups. The atmosphere at this stage was not as heated but did still have potential to turn sour. The males who were clearly drunk were shouting across our police line at the opposite faction taunting each other. We kept the line for a further 10 minutes until all factions had moved on to their respective taxis. The line was stood down by PS JOHNSON who then ordered PC BAKER and I to retrieve our vehicle from outside LIQUID and to monitor the town centre activity. Whilst on this patrol I saw that the group known as the "Reading Boys" were in a 16 seat minibus which stopped on BEAR LANE, the minibus driver had exited the vehicle and was shouting at the occupants to "SIT DOWN AND SHUT UP" before continuing on its way. A few minutes later I heard a call for assistance from an officer stating that the minibus was outside NEWBURY POLICE STATION and the "Reading boys" were "kicking off". On arrival the taxi driver had the occupants under control and no offences were disclosed. PC BAKER and I continued to monitor the town for a further 15 minutes before returning to Newbury police station.

Disorder outside Liquid Night Club

Sir

This is a report for what occurred on the night of the 29th July 2011 outside Liquid night club. At approximately 0100 hrs myself, Sc Alex Hollis, SS Alice Ashman and SC Sammy Luckett were stood outside Liquid Night club due to the amount of people that were in the premise which door staff stated was about 450.

We were first alerted to an incident that was happening inside the premise where males were fighting and door staff were trying to stop it and needed our assistance. Myself and Alex stayed outside while Alice and Sammy went in to assist door staff. More units were called in by myself due to us being out numbered.

The fight was resolved quite quickly due to the quick response of the specials and some door staff. There was no complaints and the groups were sent on their separate ways.

Throughout the night we kept a presence at Liquid as there were a few people causing issues i.e being too drunk, too aggressive and getting thrown out the club.

At approximately 0220 hrs all the specials who were attached to Op Folk were outside of Liquid when we were alerted to an incident in the club to where a male had been bottled in the smoking area and had very severe head injurys. Alice, Nina, Fiona and Alex were dealing inside with that incident while myself and Sammy were alerted to a fight which was occurring near the bus station.

The fight was very minor and yet again there were no complaints to police and both groups were put in taxis and sent on their way.

More units were then called by Alice to come and assist the Specials at Liquid as we did have a GBH. More units arrived including traffic officers and a dog handler and a dog and the possible offenders were arrested. Alice was in the medical room with the aggrieved applying first aid to the male untill the ambulance arrived. Sgt Johnson was on scene and gave the order to Liquid to close. Once the punters started coming out we had a strong police presense in front of Liquid. The specials assited door staff in moving people away from the front doors to try and get them to move on. Most persons were complying with the police requests we just had the odd few who wanted to stand in the middle of the road.

Everything was running smoothly untill a very minor scuffle happended just next to the Kennet centre door 7 between two females and whilst myself and other officers were trying to separate the females other members of the public who were from Liquid were trying to get involved and in the way. We had to push these people away to which point they got very anti and were getting in our faces.

From what I can remember the group were getting very abusive towards us and were refusing to move on as we instructed them to do so. We were then instructed by sergeant Johnson to form a line and move the group away from Liquid. The majority of the group were from Reading as I knew some of them. These were the ones who were the most aggressive out of the whole group.

As we were in the line including all the specials batons had to be drawn, I had a full view of all the non independent specials and were giving them orders as this was the first time they had been in a public order situation of this scale. I had to baton one male across the back of the legs as he grabbed hold of Nina.

I was very impressed on how the three less experienced specials handled the situation, they were calm, they listened to all instructions given by myself, sergeant Johnson and Inspector Warren. Myself and Nina done a quick debrief once we got back to the station and I stated how impressed we were with them.

Not bad for my first time running Op Folk for the specials.

We were in the town conducting licensing checks on licensed premises engaged in the night time economy. At approximately 00.30 were in the vicinity of Liquid night where Sgt Bone had come across a number of incidents, one of which required us to view the CCTV to try and capture the event on the footage but were unable to determine exactly what had happened. Sgt Bone approached the individual who was injured and tried to elicit information concerning the incident but the aggrieved was not forthcoming. Sgt Bone then engaged with a member of the door supervisors regarding the incident. As he did so I observed a male exit the venue, he was not ejected, I observed him lean against the wall next to the exit for support and stagger along it to a point where he attempted to have a cigarette. Giving up on this he tried several more times to leave the area but because of the level of intoxication it took several attempts to do so. Finally he managed to stagger away. At no point did I see any of the door supervisors attempt to attend to the male nor offer to try and find him a taxi in order for him to be taken home.





Intelligence re drinks promotions – following major disorder at Liquids DPS had been visited by PC Sutherland and discussion took place regarding actions needed to be implemented to prevent any further disorder. That revolved round the 80 pence drink promotion that was being advertised on Friday nights on their web site. DPS had agreed with officer that all advertising of promotion would be removed i.e posters, website and any other marketing tool to ensure that any customers or potential customers were in no doubt that no 80 p drinks promotion was taking place. On morning of 5th August website for Liquids Newbury was still advertising 80 p drinks if tickets were bought in advance. Also information from intelligence team to reporting officer stated that 'Lauraluminar' on facebook was advertising 80 pence promotion at Newbury Liquids and that wanted people to get down to the location asking for 600 plus to visit.

Reporting officer contacted DPS and informed him of this stating that if the advertising continued then consideration would be given to shut the venue as it was felt that imminent disorder would occur again. DPS stated that Laura was part of the marketing team – he understood our concerns and the potential for closure and stated he would ensure that all advertising was removed from website and that any other means of advertising was ceased. This did in fact take place and Liquids opened that evening without incident.

DPS arranged for extra doorstaff to be on duty and promised that the premises would as soon as possible revert to poly carbonate bottles and receptacles.

On Thursday 11th August a selection of proposed carbonate bottles and receptacles was shown to reporting officer which were to be used from this date onwards.
