Supporting Information

1. Background

- 1.1 All Local Councils are required to approve the syllabus for Religious Education for use in their schools. This task is delegated by statute to an Agreed Syllabus Conference that has representatives from all parties with a vested interest in its content and approach. In reality the membership is identical to the SACRE who monitors and supports its implementation.
- 1.2 There is a requirement for the syllabus to be reviewed every five years hence this revision.
- 1.3 It is proposed that the new syllabus takes legal effect from September 2012 and that the current one also has legal status until August 2013. By running the two in parallel it allows school to move seamlessly from one to the other at a pace that suits their particular circumstances.
- 1.4 The proposed syllabus is very similar to the current one. It is structured differently in that the guidance is taken out of the curriculum and becomes an annex. The main difference in terms of content is that the questioning approach to the curriculum has been strengthened and clarified. School have been fully consulted and the feedback is very positive.

2. Equalities Impact Assessment Outcomes

All the key religious groups in the area are represented on the SACRE and Agreed Syllabus Conference. Representatives of all the groups have been formally consulted and have contributed to the new syllabus. The proposed syllabus had unanimous approval from members of the Agreed Syllabus Conference.

3. Conclusive

The Portfolio Holder is asked to approve the revised Locally Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education to take effect from September 2012.
