Hi

I have been asked to provide additional details of the noise issues with HFC.

I have lived in Clark's Gardens for 20 yrs and over this time the noise from HFC has increased to an unacceptable level. The music being played over the tanoy system means that we can not have a windows open or sit in the garden when they have football matches or the ground is being used for other events. Also late evening music when they have parties in the club and have their doors open with music going on until midnight often.

This year the music over the tanoy has been the main issue and last year we had both the tanoy music and the parties late at night.

The Club do not notify anyone in Clark's gardens of the events, eventhough some of the properties back onto the football club site.

We understand that the football club is there but for football and not broadcast of music over the tanoy. I have no objection to them using the club house of entertainment/parties so long as they keep their doors and windows shut and act consideratly to their neighbours.

Likewise I can not see why they need to play music over the tanoy when they have a football match. Also the evening football matches and evening training sessions - they could act consideratly to their neighbours.

The noise has been tollorated previously, however I would appreciate some allowance for the residents who are directly affected by the noise from the club to be taken into consideration when considering this application.
