At its meeting of Monday 1 July 2013 Newbury Town Council's Planning & Highways Committee made the following observations:

**PREMISES LICENCE APPLICATION – SAINSBURY'S SUPERMARKETS LTD –  
170-174 ANDOVER ROAD**

**PROPOSED:** Councillor Howard Bairstow

**SECONDED:** Councillor David Allen

**RESOLVED:** That Members object for the following reasons:

- the prevention of crime and disorder
- public safety
- the prevention of public nuisance
- the protection of children from harm

**Reasons:**

- Premises license request states that store is open for 24 hours a day, when planning permission only granted 07:00-22:00 Mon-Sat and 07:30-21:00 Sundays and Bank Holidays
- Premises licence requests sale of alcohol outside of restricted store opening times
- 16 hour sale of alcohol is inappropriate in a residential area
- 16 hour sale of alcohol is inappropriate in a local convenience store
- If granted, premises licence should only be within agreed hours of opening as defined by planning process
- Concern that 16 hour sale would lead to anti social behaviour
- Concern that 16 hour sale would create a noise nuisance
