Dear Madam,

I wish to add a formal objection to the Proposal: New Premises Licence to replace existing Licence at Premises: Wokefield Park Ref No: 14/01060/LQN.

We note that the new premises licence application is requesting additional hours to play amplified sound anywhere on the site at times significantly extended to the existing licence.

I live around ½ mile from the premises. The current levels of nuisance experienced are absolutely enough. I can put up with the music and traffic emanating from the site up until 12pm midnight during the week and 1am on Saturday morning followed by the traffic leaving the site. On the occasions they have had marquee events on the site the noise is substantial. Ensuring the doors are shut on the tent does not appear to have much effect on the noise levels. The noise does keep us awake until the event is finished. That constant base beat it too much to sleep through.

I really must protest against allowing this premises to erode further the rest time that simple human beings require in order to operate effectively.

By allowing this change in hours you would be potentially allowing me a maximum of 12 hours sleep from 8am Friday morning to 12pm Sunday night 52 weeks per year and subjecting me to loud noise all weekend from 8am in the morning to 2am in the morning. I may appear grumpy now, I am certain this will not help that situation! In the words of a famous tennis player "You cannot be serious"

The present hours are enough and the outdoor/marquee events must be limited to a low number and finish at a reasonable time – certainly not 2am. Reading Festival occurs one weekend per year. Would Reading BC licence Reading Festival event every weekend of the year? I think not.

I would appreciate it if you would also remind Wokefield Park of the law pertaining to the use of fireworks after 11pm.

I am not a killjoy but enough is enough. As far as I am concerned they can drink alcohol all night in the building complex when staying there but the noise is not on.

I know we are not the only people affected.

It should be advertised in the same way planning permissions are publicised with the same orange notices, letters to close neighbours and a requirement for the Parish Council to comment. The lame attempt to display the application at the site looks purposely obstructive.
