Aims:	Improve the economic and social welfare of disadvantaged women and their families.
	Divert women from custody and reduce the impact that crime has on vulnerable women and their local community.
	Empower women by giving them the tools and techniques to become independent women making a valuable contribution to society.
Objectives:	To support vulnerable women with complex needs, including those at risk of offending to address particular behaviours and assess life circumstances that may put them in a vulnerable position or at risk of offending.
	Support women with 1:1 sessions, group work, community outreach, drop-in sessions and partner agency co-delivered courses and information sessions.
Outcomes:	Women are offered information and support in line with the 9 pathways to reducing re-offending to help them to become

	empowered to make positive life changes, develop new skills and create new opportunities. Support in the following areas; Accommodation, Attitudes, thinking and behaviour, Children, families and relationships, Domestic abuse, violence and rape, Drugs and alcohol, Education, training and employment, Finance benefit and debt, Health and well-being and Sex Working/prostitution.
Benefits:	Women are helped with the issues addressed above in a female only environment and within a 'one stop shop' which means they do not have to visit different services independently. Women are potentially diverted away from the criminal justice system.

Sex	Women fail to get the help and support they require to address their issues. This could result in increased number of women entering the criminal justice system.	Alana House run weekly themed women only drop-in sessions, where women can come and meet other women, talk things though, learn something new, speak to a practitioner about something and support each other. Without Alana House, they would not have access to this peer and professional support.
Marriage and Civil Partnership	Some women who access Alana House have experienced domestic abuse or have relationship problems. Women could find it harder to seek help for these issues.	Alana House have a good working relationship with a local domestic abuse charity that supports women, A2 Dominion. They work together to facilitate appropriate referrals between the two organisations.
Pregnancy and Maternity	It is likely that some women who access Alana House will be pregnant and it is well known that domestic abuse can start during pregnancy.	As above
Disability	Some women who access Alana House have experienced mental health problems and require support to deal with these.	The support worker has 1:1 sessions with women who have disclosed a mental health condition.
