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	Building more local care homes, extending existing provision	We continue to look at options to improve the viability and sustainability of our own homes. Chestnut Walk is situated on a compact site and therefore it is not possible to increase its scale for the current purpose.					
		We are interested in developing a larger home but this is not a short term solution due to the availability of land and capital investment that would be required.					
		The idea around extending and use of Alice Bye Court and Redwood House is a interesting concept, but due to restrictions on the sites and land it would not be possible to achieve this.  We are working to ensure we retain staff and will hold vacancies within services that have a similar role, to enable these staff to be retained within the council and services.
