Key issues raised:	Concern that the proposal would lead to the closure of the centre, which along with other proposals would disadvantage those people with transport issues from accessing a leisure facility. Suggestion that the centre could be run by volunteers (one respondent), the Parish Council are considering options for the continuation of the centre.						
Equality issues:	None were drawn out from the responses that related to the strands in the Equality legislation. Respondents did highlight that those with transport issues could be disadvantaged.
