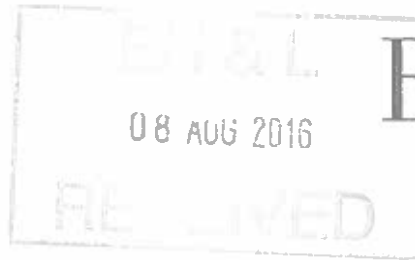

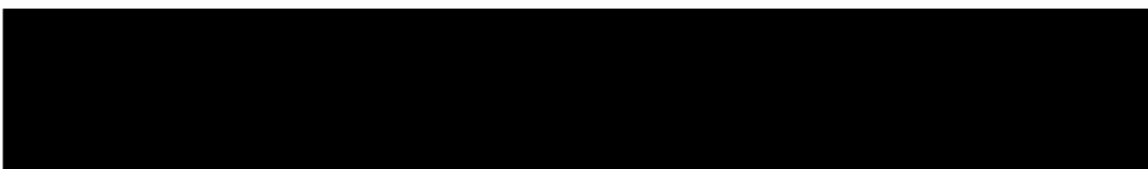

The Prevention of Crime and Disorder:

Groups emerging from scheduled drinking time often behave in a way which seems justifiable at the time but in reality is crime & disorder for which residents pay & suffer. There are cars parked along side the road, long driver hedges, sheds, garages etc. All quiet for a bit of fun & litter.

Public Safety:

The road to the Club is narrow, already unsafe. It has narrowed to ~~one~~ one-lane in many places because it is falling away on the field side & breaking up. In recent years the increase in traffic is severe & late night traffic can only make this worse, with residents having to put up with the consequences.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance:

If the Club's extended licence hours are to succeed, people from a wide area will be needed in goodly numbers for many nights a week. Such people extend their drinking time to an extra session to have a "good time" often in groups their enjoyment often at its height when they leave in cars or on foot. Not suitable for an area of outstanding natural beauty.

The Protection of Children from Harm:

People often choose to bring up their children in a quiet rural location. To have traffic coming & going past their houses late into the night, for extra drinking time for group events, might have been the reason they left towns in the first place.
