



Details of issue categories:

Fence: encroachment and obstruction, including electric.

Intimidating: animal, person or sign.

Land Use: building, crops, excavation, ploughing, cropping, gallops.

Maintain: bridge, culvert, gate, other structure, information signage, signs and waymarks, steps.

Other: electric structure, unbridged watercourse, rubbish, user conflict. **Surface**: muddy, potholed, gullied, rutted, waterlogged, Streetworks problem.

Vegetation: surface, overhanging, tree.

Proposed timescales for inspection and resolution (from Draft Enforcement Policy)

Safety hazard or threat			Within 5 days	Resolve the immediate safety issue within a working day, this might mean signage and fencing off a hazard, or closing the right of way.
High	3 weeks	3 weeks	3 months	
Medium	5 weeks	5 weeks	9 months	
Low	8 weeks			Log on database and monitor the priority. Responsible party may be contacted, to bring the offence to their attention, stating that action may be taken in the future.
Ploughing and cropping surface disturbance of footpaths or bridleways.			After cultivation, path surface must be made good to at least the minimum width within 14 days of the first disturbance or 24 hours after a second or subsequent disturbance.	
Permanent obstructions			Diversion to be considered, in accordance with the Statement of Priorities for path orders. Timescale governed by priority and resources for processing diversion applications.	
Legal Notice required			Time extended by period to be stipulated on the Notice, plus necessary officer time for preparation.
