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# **Executive Report**

# 1. Introduction

- 1.1 Members of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Commission considered a request on the 16<sup>th</sup> June 2009 from Councillor David Holtby for a review into accessibility of public transport within the district. The request was prompted by the adoption of the national Bus Pass Scheme by West Berkshire Council and the authority's wish for residents to make the best possible use of them.
- 1.2 The Overview and Scrutiny Management Commission agreed that the issues of access to public transport should be examined by the Stronger Communities Select Committee (whilst the Greener Select Committee considers mixed mode transport and Local Transport Plan 3).
- 1.3 Subsequently at the meeting of the Overview and Scrutiny Management Commission on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2009 it was decided that a joint review should be undertaken by the Greener Select Committee and the Stronger Communities Select Committee. A Task Group has been established to undertake this review.
- 1.4 This report proposes Terms of Reference and a review methodology for examination of the topic.

# 2. Terms of Reference

- 2.1 The Select Committee propose to conduct a review into the use, accessibility, availability and affordability of public transport in West Berkshire and will consider, in particular:
  - Whether the demand for public transport is being met.
  - The obstacles to the use of public transport usage.
  - Consider what is being done and can be done further to improve the use of public transport.
  - Report to the Executive with recommendations for changes in the current arrangements.

# 3. Operation and delivery

3.1 The review will be on the agenda for the Greener Select Committee on 19 January 2010 and following this meeting the Task Group will continue to scrutinise the subject matter. A number of witnesses will be called to give evidence, the detailed scope and methodology for which is detailed at Appendix A.

# 4. Recommendation

4.1 That the Greener Select Committee and Members of the Stronger Communities Select Committee, receive evidence from WBC Planning and Transport Policy Manager and WBC Transport Services Manager. Members to question officers and identify further evidence required for the task group to investigate.
