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Supporting Information

1. Background

- 1.1 There is a requirement within sections 139-142 of the Transport Act 2000 for transport authorities in England and Wales to produce a Bus Information Strategy to publicise and promote local bus information.
- 1.2 Attached to this report is West Berkshires Bus Information Strategy. We have renamed this the Public Transport Information Strategy to reflect the need for information across the range of public transport and not just buses. The Strategy (appended as Appendix 1) contains information on why the Strategy has been produced; what information requirements have been considered; what the different ways are to meet that information need, and in the last chapter, how the information will be delivered.

2. Consultation

- 2.1 A public consultation exercise was carried out in autumn 2003. A wide range of bodies including Town and Parish Councils, private bus operators, neighbouring authorities, the traffic commissioner and the Government Office for the South East were sent a copy of the draft which was also made available on the Council's web site. Full details of who was consulted are provided in paragraph 1.8 (page 2) of the strategy.
- 2.2 The consultation generated a disappointing response. However, the Government Office gave a very thorough response which was generally positive. Where possible, all comments have been reflected in the revised public transport information strategy.

3. Next Steps

3.1 Subject to the Planning and Development Committee's comments, it is proposed that the Public Transport Information Strategy be submitted at the end of July to the Government Office for the South East alongside the 2003/04 Annual Progress Report on the Local Transport Plan.
