

Summary of Individual Executive Member Decision taken on 25 September 2007

Speed Limit Review July 2007

Resolved that the Executive Member for Planning and Highways approve the recommendations as set out in section 3 of the report:

1. That the following be progressed to the statutory advertisement and consultation stage:
 1. Church Road Aldermaston - extension of 30 mph speed limit.
 3. Hampstead Marshall - extension of 30mph at either end of village.
 7. Brightwalton Green - introduction of 30mph speed limit.
 8. Eastbury village - extension of 30mph speed limit at either end of village
 9. High Street, Upper Lambourn - introduction of 30mph speed limit.
 10. Harts Hill Road Floral Way to Upper Bucklebury – Extend 40mph speed limit from Floral Way to include new development.
 11. The Broadway & High Street Thatcham renewal of 20mph speed limit
2. That the Task Group's recommendations that no further action be taken on the following requests with regard to the speed limit, but further measures should be considered where shown below, be approved
 2. Fir Tree Lane, Newbury - introduction of 20mph speed limit in vicinity of School. Agreed to investigate various measures for the road in consultation with the Ward Members and Parish Council to address the Parish Council concerns.
 4. Kintbury Road, Inkpen - extension of 30mph speed limit
 5. B4494 Leckhampstead Chapel Arch to Egypt - Introduction of 50mph speed limit.
 6. B4494 Lilley to South Oxfordshire border - Introduction of 50mph speed limit
3. That all the persons requesting the speed limit amendments be informed of the Executive Members decision.
4. That, subject to there being no objections received to the statutory consultation for individual Traffic Regulation Orders for each speed limit, the advertised restrictions be introduced.

This decision is eligible to be 'called-in'. However, if the decision has not been 'called-in' by 5.00pm on 4 October 2007, then it will be implemented.
