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Supporting Information

1. Background

- 1.1 To comply with best practice in respect of maintenance of the West Berkshire road network during the winter, the Highway and Transport Service produces a Winter Service Plan each year setting out its operational proposals for Members to consider.
- 1.2 For 2007/08 the scope of the plan has been extended to include adverse weather events such as flooding.

2. Winter Service Plan

- 2.1 Several requests for roads to be added to the primary salting network were received over the course of the last winter from Members, various Parish Councils and members of the public. However, none of the requests for salting achieved the criteria for inclusion in the primary salting network. Therefore no changes are proposed to the primary salting network this year.
- 2.2 No new secondary salting routes have been proposed by Members, Parish Councils or members of the public.
- 2.3 Officers recommend that for the winter season of 2007/2008 the primary network should not be increased. The total primary salted network remains 37.7% of the total road network in West Berkshire.
- 2.4 A draft copy of the Council's revised leaflet "Safer Driving this Winter on West Berkshire Roads" can be found in Appendix 6. This leaflet will be available in all Council buildings with public access as well as on the Council's website. Copies will also be distributed to all Town and Parish Council's.
- 2.5 The salting of the secondary network will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the Winter Service Plan although there is no specific budget for this operation.
- 2.6 A report highlighting the recommendations detailed in the Code of Practice for Highway Maintenance Management 'Well Maintained Highways' (July 2005) is given in Appendix 4.
- 2.7 The footway snow clearance routes have been revised this summer in line with the recommendations of the Well Maintained Highways Code of Good Practice for Highway Maintenance Management.
- 2.8 The sand bag policy is currently being reviewed following widespread flooding across the district on 20 July 2007 and will be updated once approved.

3. Operational Arrangements for 2007/2008

3.1 The winter service period for 2007/2008 will operate from Monday 29 October 2007 (week 44) to Sunday 6 April 2008 (week 14) although this period will be extended if weather conditions dictate.

The decision to salt will be made by the West Berkshire Duty Officer, based on forecast information supplied by the Met Office and local roadside weather stations. Once a decision is made, the Duty Officer will inform the Council's Term Maintenance Contractor Fitzpatrick and if instructed, the defined primary network will be treated with an application of rock salt to prevent the formation of hoarfrost and/or ice.

Individual Executive Member Decision taken on 4 October 2007

- 3.2 During prolonged hazardous conditions (defined as sub-zero conditions that have been experienced for at least 72 hours), a decision whether to salt the secondary road and town centre footway networks will be made by the Council's Winter Service Manager. This role is normally performed by the Principal Engineer (Highways Maintenance) or in his absence by a Project Engineer.
- 3.3 As detailed in the Council's information leaflet 'Safer Driving this Winter on West Berkshire Roads', the Council does not recommend the use of bicycles during periods of prolonged hazardous conditions. With the exception of shared carriageway/cycleway routes on a primary or secondary salting route, shared footway/cycleway and remote cycleway networks are not salted when hoar frost, ice or prolonged hazardous conditions are forecast. Being part of the carriageway, shared carriageway/cycleway routes on the primary and secondary salting route networks will be salted.
- 3.4 There is no provision within the current winter service budget for farmers or other contractors to formally assist the Council in the removal of snow deposits from the rural road network. Snow clearance of the Primary and Secondary routes will continue to be carried out in accordance with the Winter Service Plan by the Council's Contractor Fitzpatrick using their own equipment.

Local Performance Indicator – efficiency review of Primary salting routes and proposed changes.

Due to the severe flooding experienced during July 2007 (and the subsequent on going clean up operations) staff from both West Berkshire Council and Fitzpatrick Contractors Ltd. have not been able to review the efficiency of the Primary salting network this summer.

It has been agreed that this will be completed next summer when Fitzpatrick Contractors Ltd. have used their fleet of new gritting vehicles (due for delivery in October 2007) and have a complete years data from their global positioning recording system available to analyse.
