Supporting Information

1. Background

- 1.1 To comply with best practice in respect of maintenance of the West Berkshire road network during the winter, the Highway and Transport Service produces a Winter Service Plan and Adverse Weather Plan each year setting out its operational proposals for Members to consider.
- 1.2 The plan also includes the current sand bag distribution policy; however this will be updated in early autumn 2008 by Carolyn Murison following major flooding events in July 2007.

2. Winter Service Plan

- 2.1 A small number of requests for roads to be added to the primary salting network were received over the course of the last winter from Members, various Parish Councils and members of the public. However, none of these requests for salting met the criteria for inclusion in the primary salting network. No changes are therefore proposed to the primary salting network this year.
 - No new secondary salting routes have been proposed by Members, Parish Councils or members of the public.
- 2.2 A request was received from Chaddleworth Parish Council to re-site an existing salt bin at the junction of Glebe Fields and Main Street to Tower Hill.
 - The new site proposed does meet the criteria for the siting of a salt bin however local residents were consulted and those who responded wanted the bin to remain in its present location. It is therefore recommended that the salt bin remains in its current position.
- 2.3 Officers recommend that for the winter season of 2008/2009 the primary network should not be increased. The total primary salted network remains 38.0% of the total road network in West Berkshire.
- 2.4 A draft copy of the Council's revised leaflet "Safer Driving this Winter on West Berkshire Roads" can be found in Appendix 6. This leaflet will be available in all Council buildings with public access as well as on the Council's website. Copies will also be distributed to all Town and Parish Council's.
- 2.5 The salting of the secondary network will be undertaken in accordance with the requirements of the Winter Service Plan although there is no specific budget for this operation.
- 2.6 A report highlighting the departures from the current recommendations detailed in the Code of Practice for Highway Maintenance Management 'Well Maintained Highways' (July 2005) is given in Appendix 4.
- 2.7 A benchmarking exercise to compare the percentage of roads gritted in other highway authorities has been completed. This shows that at 38 % West Berkshire grits a higher than average percentage of its primary road network than those benchmarked, the average is 33.0%.

3. Operational Arrangements for 2008/2009

- 3.1 The winter service period for 2008/2009 will operate from Monday 3 November 2008 (week 45) to Sunday 5 April 2009 (week 14) although this period will be extended if weather conditions dictate as was the case in April 2008.
- 3.2 The decision to salt will be made by the West Berkshire Duty Officer, based on forecast information supplied by the Met Office and local roadside weather stations. Once a decision is made, the Duty Officer will inform the Council's Term Maintenance Contractor Fitzpatrick and if instructed, the defined primary network will be treated with an application of rock salt to prevent the formation of hoar frost and/or ice.
- 3.3 During prolonged hazardous conditions (defined as sub-zero conditions that have been experienced for at least 72 hours), a decision whether to salt the secondary road and town centre footway networks will be made by the Council's Winter Service Manager. This role is normally performed by the Principal Engineer (Highways Maintenance) or in his absence by a Project Engineer.
- 3.4 With the exception of shared carriageway/cycleway routes on a primary or secondary salting route, shared footway/cycleway and remote cycleway networks are not salted when hoar frost, ice or prolonged hazardous conditions are forecast. Being part of the carriageway, shared carriageway/cycleway routes on the primary and secondary salting route networks will be salted.
- 3.5 There is no provision within the current winter service budget for farmers or other contractors to formally assist the Council in the removal of snow deposits from the rural road network. Snow clearance of the Primary and Secondary routes will continue to be carried out in accordance with the Winter Service Plan by the Council's Contractor Fitzpatrick using their own equipment.
