PANG, KENNET & LAMBOURN VALLEYS COUNTRYSIDE PROJECTS

CONSTITUTION

Name: The name of the association is PANG, KENNET & LAMBOURN VALLEYS COUNTRYSIDE PROJECTS.

Aim: To enhance and protect the natural beauty of the Pang, Kennet and Lambourn valleys and to help people appreciate the countryside.

 Subject to the matters set out below the Projects and its property shall be administered and managed in accordance with this constitution by the members of the Steering Group, constituted by clause 7 of this constitution.

2. The Projects objectives are:

- Conserve and enhance the biodiversity of the natural environment and landscapes in the project areas.
- Promote environmentally responsible farming practices throughout the project areas.
- Increase awareness of countryside and environmental issues through education and interpretation.
- Involve all sectors of the community in caring for and appreciating the local environment and countryside.

4. Powers:

In furtherance of the objectives but not otherwise the Steering Group may exercise the following powers;

- (a) power to raise funds and to invite and receive contributions provided that in raising funds the Steering Group shall not undertake any substantial permanent trading activities and shall conform to any relevant requirements of law;
- (b) power to buy, take on lease or exchange any property necessary for the achievement of the objectives and to maintain and equip it for use;
- (c) power subject to any consents required by law to sell, lease or dispose of all or any part of the property of the group;
- (d) power to employ or contract such staff as are necessary for the proper pursuit of the objectives;
- (e) power to co-operate with other voluntary bodies, charities and statutory authorities operating in furtherance of the objectives or of similar purposes and to exchange information and advice with them;
- (f) power to establish or support any associations, charitable trusts or institutions formed for all or any of the objectives;
- (g) power to appoint and constitute such advisory committees as the Steering Group may think fit;

(h) power to do all such other lawful things as is necessary for the achievement of the objectives.

5. Membership:

- (a) Membership of the Group shall be open to individuals over the age of 18 years and any body representing a corporate or unincorporated association [any such body being called in this constitution a 'member organisation'] who are interested in furthering the work of the Group and who have applied and been elected by a majority of the Steering Group and who have paid any annual subscription laid down from time to time by the Steering Group.
- (b) Each member organisation shall appoint an individual to represent it and to vote on its behalf at meetings of the Group and may appoint an alternative to replace its appointed representative at any meeting of the Group if the appointed representative is unable to attend.
- (c) Every member and member organisation shall have one vote.
- (d) The Steering Group may by majority vote terminate the membership of any individual or member organisation, where the actions of that individual or member organisation, in the opinion of the Steering Group, would bring the Group into disrepute or do not fall within the spirit of this constitution. The individual or member organisation concerned shall have the right to be heard by the Steering Group, accompanied by a friend, before a final decision is made.

Steering Group:

- (a) The Steering Group shall consist of 3 officers: a chair, secretary and treasurer and up to 2 ordinary members. At the AGM of the Group, the members shall elect from amongst themselves a Steering Group who shall hold office from the conclusion of that meeting.
- (b) The Steering Group may in addition appoint co-opted members but so that there must be more elected members of the Steering Group than co-opted members. Each appointment of a co-opted member shall be made at a meeting of the Steering Group and shall take effect from the end of the meeting unless the appointment is to fill a place that has not been vacated in which case the appointment shall run from the date when the post becomes vacant.
- (c) All members of the Steering Group shall retire from office together at the end of the annual general meeting next after the date on which they came into office but they may be re-elected or re-appointed.
- (d) The proceedings of the Steering Group shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their numbers or by any failure to appoint or any defect in the appointment or qualification of a member.
- (e) Not more than one third of the members of the Steering Group may be representatives of either a local authority or a landfill operator.
- (f) A member of the Steering Group shall cease to hold office if he or she;
- (g) becomes incapable by reason of mental disorder, illness or injury of managing and administering his or her own affairs.

- (h) is absent without permission of the Steering Group from all their meetings held within a period of six months and the Steering Group shall resolve that his or her office be vacated; or
- (i) notifies to the Steering Group a wish to resign.
- (j) Any notice required to be served on any member shall be in writing and shall be served by the secretary or the Steering Group either personally or by post and any letter posted will be deemed to have been received within 10 days of posting.
- (k) No member of the Steering Group shall acquire any interest in property belonging to the Group [other than as a trustee of the Group] or receive remuneration or be interested [other than as a member of the Steering Group] in any contract entered into by the Steering Group.
- Should the elected members of the Steering Group fall below 3, then a special general meeting must be called to elect replacement members.

7. Meetings:

- (a) The Steering Group shall hold at least four ordinary meetings each year. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman or any two members of the Steering Group upon not less than 4 days notice being given to the other members of the Steering Group of the matters to be discussed but if the matters include an appointment of a co-opted member not less than 21 days notice must be given.
- (b) The Chairman shall act as chairman at meetings of the Steering Group. If the Chairman is absent from any meeting, the members of the Steering Group present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of the meeting before any other business is transacted.
- (c) There shall be a quorum when at least one third of the members or two in number of the Steering Group are present, whichever is the greater.
- (d) Every matter shall be determined by a majority of the votes of the Steering Group, the Chairman holding a casting vote where necessary.
- (e) The Steering Group shall keep minutes of their meetings and those of any subcommittee.
- (f) The Steering Group may make and alter rules for the conduct of their business. No rule may be made which is inconsistent with this constitution.
- (g) The Steering Group may appoint sub-committees, which remain under their authority and which must report promptly all their actions and proceedings.
- (h) The Steering Group shall cause the title to all lands and investments held by the Group to be administered by responsible trustees or corporations.

8. Banking:

(a) The funds of the Group, including all donations and bequests, shall be paid into an account operated by the Farming & Wildlife Advisory Group in the name of the Group. All cheques drawn on the account must be authorised by two members of the Steering Group. (b) The funds of the Group shall be applied only in furthering the objectives.

9. Accounts:

The Steering Group shall;

- (a) keep accounting records for the Group;
- (b) prepare annual statements of account for the Group;
- (c) arrange for the auditing or independent examination of the statements of account for the Group.

10. AGM:

- (a) There shall be an annual general meeting of the Group which shall be held in the month of May in each year or as soon as practicable thereafter.
- (b) Every annual general meeting shall be called by the Steering Group. The Secretary shall give at least 21 days notice of the meeting to all members of the Group.
- (c) Before any other business the members of the Group present at the annual general meeting have the right to vote for a chairman of that meeting other than the chairman of the Steering Group.
- (d) The Steering Group shall present to the annual general meeting the report and accounts of the Group for the preceding year.
- (e) Nominations for election to the Steering Group must be seconded and made by members of the Group in writing and must be in the hands of the secretary by 1 April in any year.
- (f) Should nominations exceed vacancies, election shall be by a show of hands at the AGM.
- (g) The Secretary or other person specially appointed shall keep a full record of proceedings at every general meeting.
- (h) There shall be a quorum when at least one tenth of the number of members, or 3 members, whichever is the greater, are present at any general meeting.

11. Special general meetings:

The Steering Group may call a special general meeting of the Group at any time. If at least two thirds of the members request such a meeting in writing stating the business to be considered, the Secretary shall call such a meeting. At least 21 days notice must be given. The notice must state the business to be discussed.

12. Constitution:

The Constitution may be altered by a resolution passed by not less than two thirds of the members present and voting at an annual general meeting. The notice of the meeting must include notice of the resolution, setting out the terms of the alteration proposed.

13. Dissolution:

If the Steering Group decides that it is necessary or desirable to dissolve the Group it shall call a special general meeting of all members, giving not less than 21 days notice. If the proposal is accepted by a two thirds majority of those members present and voting, the Steering Group shall have the power to realise any assets held by or on behalf of the Group. Any assets remaining after the satisfaction of any proper debts and liabilities shall be given or transferred to such other institution or institutions having objectives similar to the objectives of the Group as the members of the Group may determine or failing that shall be applied for some other similar purpose.

14. Liability:

The Group and its Steering Group will not accept liability for any injury to members or guests or loss or damage to members' or guests' property or the actions of members or guests occurring during Group activities, however the injury, damage or action was caused.

Supporting Information

1. Background

1.1 Background – Royal Berkshire Fire Authority

- 1.2 Five Members of the Council are required to serve as Members of the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority. Members are responsible for setting the Fire and Rescue Service operating budget and determining how the service is run. The Authority comprises 25 local councillors appointed by the six unitary authorities in the county: Bracknell Forest Borough Council (3 seats); Reading Borough Council (4 seats); Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead (4 seats); Slough Borough Council (3 seats); West Berkshire Council (5 seats) and Wokingham District Council (5 seats).
- 1.3 Appointments to the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority are made on a proportionality basis based on the electoral roll.
- 1.4 At the Executive meeting held on 17 May 2007, it was agreed that the decision regarding Member representation would be delegated to Councillor Graham Jones, Leader of Council and Councillor Jeff Brooks, Leader of the Opposition.
- 1.5 The Leader of Council and Leader of the Opposition, working through their Group Executives, agreed that representation would be split 4-1 for the first two years of Council (2007-09) and 3-2 for the subsequent two years (2009-11).
- 1.6 The current representatives are Councillors Jeff Brooks, Paul Bryant, Adrian Edwards, Geoff Findlay and Emma Webster.
- 1.7 Meetings of the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority take place in the evenings, on a quarterly basis, at various venues in the County.
- 1.8 Councillors Owen Jeffery, Jeff Brooks, Emma Webster, Paul Bryant and Adrian Edwards have expressed an interest in representing West Berkshire Council on the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority.
- 1.9 On the 27 April 2009 West Berkshire Council's Monitoring Officer received a request from the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority 'to have greater certainty in its membership' and they therefore requested that the Council 'consider making those appointments for a period of 4 years or, if this is unacceptable, for such period as your authority determines'. Officers have considered this request and suggest that the Council align the appointment to the Council's election cycle. It is therefore proposed that the Councillors be appointed until May 2011 and that subsequent appointments be made for four year periods in line with local elections. These longer term appointments will be at the discretion of the Leader of the Council and will be reviewed if required.

2. Background - Thames Valley Police Authority

2.1 The Thames Valley Police Authority (TVPA) consists of 19 members, of whom 10 are elected Members (one each from the six Berkshire unitaries, Milton Keynes and Buckinghamshire County Council and two from Oxfordshire County Council). The membership of the TVPA is the responsibility of the TVPA Joint Committee, who

must have regard to the political balance across the Thames Valley area (based upon the total number of council seats held by each party). Should the Joint Committee decide that a change in membership of the TVPA is required the normal practice is for the Joint Committee to invite local authorities to nominate a representative who meets with the requirement for political balance.

- 2.2 The Joint Committee meet again in June 2009 to review the composition of the TVPA, taking account of any changes as a result of the local elections.
- 2.3 The current West Berkshire representative is Councillor Anthony Stansfeld.
- 2.4 Councillors Anthony Stansfeld has expressed an interest in continuing to represent West Berkshire Council on the Thames Valley Police Authority.

3. Conclusion

- 3.1 That Members appoint representatives to the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority and Thames Valley Police as noted above.
- 3.2 That the term of office for the Royal Berkshire Fire Authority be agreed in line with paragraph 1.9

I write to advise that at the meeting of the Fire Authority on 16 April, the Authority considered a report regarding membership of the Authority. On the basis of the electoral roll figures I asked the Unitary Authorities for earlier this year, from the Annual Meeting of the Authority in June the Fire Authority will have 24 Members in fact, although the number of seats will remain at 25.
