Supporting Information

1. Background

- 1.1 The Local Development Scheme (LDS) is a public statement setting out details of which development plan documents (DPDs) will be produced by the Council as part of its Local Plan, and the timetable for producing them. The current LDS shows that between 2013 and 2016 the Council is intending to produce a Minerals and Waste Development Plan Document for West Berkshire.
- 1.2 One of the early stages in the production of the Minerals and Waste DPD is to approach land owners, developers, land owning public bodies, land agents and other stakeholders and request details of any site that think has potential to be developed for either mineral activities or waste activities.
- 1.3 Following the "call for sites" all the submissions will be evaluated and a draft Minerals and Waste DPD produced which will be the subject of extensive consultations prior to a final Minerals and Waste DPD being consulted on the spring of 2015. The Minerals and Waste DPD will then be subject to an independent Examination in Public and is scheduled to be adopted by the Council in September 2016.

2. Call for Sites


- 2.1 The attached "Call for Sites" form will be sent to all Parish Councils, land owners, mineral operators waste management operators and the wider public who are invited to put forward potential mineral and waste development sites by 31st December 2013.
- 2.2 The Minerals and Waste team are seeking to gather as much information as possible about potential sites that can inform and provide evidence for preparation of the Minerals and Waste DPD.
- 2.3 The identification of sites does not imply that the Council considers that the site is suitable for development, either now or in the future. It cannot be taken as representing either an intention to allocate these sites, or as a material consideration in the determination of a planning application.
- 2.4 Potential sites that have been identified will be further tested through the planmaking process for Development Plan Documents, including Sustainability Appraisal/ Strategic Environmental Assessment, several stages of public participation and independent examination, under the guidance and direction of the Planning Policy Task Group.
