1 Purpose of the Report

1.1 To approve the school funding formula distribution for 2025/26.

2 Recommendations

- 2.1 To approve the 2025/26 school funding formula to be distributed to schools. The allocations have been made according to the principles agreed by Schools' Forum in December and in relation to the total funding available from the Schools Block DSG.
- 2.2 To note that the Authority Proforma Tool (APT) will be submitted to the Department for Education (DfE) on 22 January 2025
- 2.3 To note that the final formula rates and allocations will be notified to schools by 28th February 2025.

4 Executive Summary

- 4.1 2025/26 is the third year of transition to the direct schools National Funding Formula (NFF). Each Local Authority (LA) will continue to have some discretion over their schools funding formulae, in consultation with local schools. The LA is responsible for making the final decisions on the formula.
- 4.2 Political ratification is required for the LA to be able to issue budgets to maintained schools. Allocations must be distributed to schools by 28th February 2025.
- 4.3 A consultation was held between 16 October 2024 and 6 November 2024. The responses were considered by the Schools Forum in December 2024, and a methodology for distributing the funding was agreed.
- 4.4 The final DSG funding notification was received from the DfE in December 2024 totalling £143.6m, including a growth allocation of £0.3m. A decision will be made at the Schools Forum in January 2025 following the recommendation to add the DSG growth funding allocation for 2025/26 into the school formula and allocate to schools.

5 Supporting Information

Introduction

- 5.1 A consultation was held between 16 October 2024 and 6 November 2024. The responses were considered by the Schools Forum in December 2024, and the following agreed:
 - (a) To mirror the Department for Education's (DfE) 2025/26 National Funding Formula (NFF) to calculate the funding allocations.
 - (b) To address any surplus or shortfall in funding by adjusting the AWPU values.
 - (c) To use the full sparsity factor.
 - (d) To apply a 0% top slice to schools' funding.
 - (e) To approve the criteria to be used to allocate additional funds.
 - (f) To approve the proposed services to be de-delegated.
- 5.2 A decision will be made at the Schools Forum in January 2025 following the recommendation to add the DSG growth funding allocation for 2025/26 into the school formula and allocate to schools. This paper assumes that is agreed.

5.3 The final DSG funding notification was received from the DfE in December 2024 totalling £143.6m, including a growth allocation of £0.3m.

Growth Funding 2025/26

- 5.4 The main DSG funding for schools is lagged and based on pupil numbers from the previous October census. Since 2019/20, growth funding is allocated to the local authority by formula and forms part of the Schools Block DSG. The formula for allocating growth funding to each LA is based on actual growth in pupil numbers.
- 5.5 This funding can be put aside into a Growth Fund, where it can be awarded to schools under certain criteria. If not required for growth, it can be added into the school formula, but if there is a shortfall, this needs to be met from a top slice of the main schools' block allocation. As it is within the schools block, a movement of funding between the schools formula and the Growth Fund is not treated as a transfer between blocks.
- 5.6 The cumulative balance on our Growth Fund was £0.8m at 31.3.2024 and is forecast to be £0.69m by 31.3.2025. The DSG growth funding for 2025/26 is £307k. The projected balance of our Growth Fund is sufficient, so the Schools' Forum will make a decision in January 2025 following the recommendation to add the DSG growth funding allocated for 2025/26 into the school formula to distribute to schools.
