There should be a regular programme of exercising and update of corporate and service plans, so that there is embedded iteration of the Business Continuity process, and issues/ unknowns that are identified are addressed.	The 2025/26 Training & Exercising prospectus will continue to include the existing BC training and look to develop some more training for Service Directors and Exec Directors. There's no funding directly associated with training of senior managers for business continuity, meaning further developments in training will need to be completed by JEPU. With the approval of the paper by SLT any service listed as requiring immediate restoration will hold an annual exercise against one of the four scenarios, whereas those listed as priority service will hold a biannual exercise. All other services in the council, will be encouraged to hold team based exercises. The seasonal influenza exercise will ensure a large percentage of plans are exercised this year.
