The Fuel Boat (registered name Frederick) is a diesel-powered canal narrowboat approx 21.3m in length and approx 2m width. It is registered with the Canal & River Trust under registration number 520859. It operates with a Roving Traders Licence as a fuel boat selling diesel, smokeless fuels, chandlery and basic boating items for boaters and walkers along the towpath. This application is for the grant of a premises licence to also allow the off sale of alcohol to these customers. No member of the public will be allowed to board the vessel and sales of alcohol shall only occur when the vessel is stationary. The Fuel Boat is currently moored at the Kennet & Avon Canal, near Station Road, Kintbury but will be moved within other inland waterways.

- A written notice of 'authority' record shall be maintained by the premises licence holder for all staff who sell alcohol
- There shall be comprehensive training for staff in the main requirements of the Licensing Act 2003, the specific measures and conditions in place to promote the Licensing Objectives and the staff roles and responsibilities. Such records shall be available for inspection by the responsible authorities.
- Customers shall not be permitted to board the vessel
- Alcohol products must be sold and leave the vessel in sealed containers

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- CCTV coverage shall be provided in the form of a recordable system, capable of providing pictures of evidential quality in all lighting conditions particularly facial recognition.
- Cameras shall encompass all ingress and egress to the vessel and the point of sale of alcohol.
- Equipment shall be maintained in good working order and checked every 12 months.
- The system shall record in real time and operate whilst the premises are conducting licensable activities.
- The recordings shall be kept available for a minimum period of 28 days and handed to Police or Local Authority Officer on request.
- The Recording equipment shall be kept in a secure environment under the control of the Premises Licence Holder or other responsible named individual.
- Appropriate signage representative of the above shall be displayed in conspicuous positions.
- There will be sufficient members of trained staff available to be able to download evidence with the minimum of delay at the request of the Police or Local Authority approved officer
- Staff shall be trained on security issues including how to identify and refuse service to customers that are drunk or appear to be drunk.

c) Public safety

- The sale of alcohol shall only be permitted when the vessel is stationary
- The approved arrangements at the vessel, including means of escape provisions, emergency warning and life saving equipment, the electrical installation and mechanical equipment, shall at all material times be maintained in good condition and full working order.
- The means of escape provided for the vessel shall be maintained unobstructed and free of trip hazards.

The prevention of public nuisance

• No waste or recyclable materials, including bottles, shall be moved within, removed from or placed in outside areas between (22.00) hours and (08.00) hours on the following day

d) The protection of children from harm

- The business will be promoted as family friendly and suitable for all ages. Should children be in attendance, there will be no inappropriate promotions, activities or behaviour tolerated at the vessel that might put children at risk.
- A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the vessel where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
- A record shall be kept detailing all refused sales of alcohol. The record should include the date and time of the refused sale and the name of the member of staff who refused the sale. The record shall be available for inspection at the vessel by the police or other responsible authority at all times whilst the vessel is in use.

 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
