It is understood that the schools provide different sessions and that these may even vary term by term. This information is not required in detail in this policy document. ## Policy amended.

\* The later deadlines for application and allocation (referred to above) would meet administrative concerns of some providers, but would not fit with the existing practices for others. The meeting discussed whether there were any set of dates which could work across the board, and those present agreed that there is not a conherent pattern which would suit all providers.

However, there is a concern that the lack of any agreed dates would leave parents to seek information from the settings individually and could result in confusion and difficulties for parents if they wished to apply to a number of settings.

This also provides a risk of those being offered a place at one school refusing it a short time after due to an offer from a school with a later allocation date. Published arrangements should ideally provide parents with the knowledge of when and how the
